#### Purpose

The purpose of this proposed regulatory action is to develop a General Permit for water withdrawal activities that have minimal individual and cumulative impact on instream beneficial uses and flow regimes of the receiving waterbody. This new regulation is needed to decrease the cost and time involved in obtaining individual permits for activities with minimal environmental impact while ensuring environmental protection.

# Legal Basis

The basis for this regulation is provided for in Sections 62.1-44.15 and 62.1-44.15:5 of the Code of Virginia, which authorize the Board to adopt rules governing the issuance of water quality permits and to issue Virginia Water Protection Permits consistent with the provisions of the Clean Water Act and to protect instream beneficial uses. 9VAC-24-210-10 et seq., Virginia Water Protection Permit Program Regulation, requires permits for water withdrawals as a regulated activity.

## Need

The VWP general permits are intended to simplify and streamline the permitting process for activities in state waters that have a minor individual and cumulative impact to the environment. The proposed changes will allow for a more efficient and understandable application submittal and review and authorization issuance process. In turn, this will allow for greater consistency and predictability for the public and less regulatory burden.

#### Substance

The general permit would limit the maximum withdrawal from a water body based on the size and geographic location of the stream or pond. Furthermore the general permit would include a maximum absolute daily withdrawal beyond which an individual permit would be required. It is also anticipated that the permit would incorporate recommended conservation measures from the Drought Monitoring and Response Report that would be implemented in the event that the State Drought coordinator declared a drought emergency. Applicants would be required to file a registration statement. Those water withdrawers not covered by this general permit would still require an individual VWP permit.

The alternative of not developing this General Permit would increase staff workload with little environmental benefit and would assess large permit fees and detailed permit conditions for small water withdrawals that do not significantly affect streamflow or instream beneficial uses.
