The Virginia Pollution Abatement (VPA) Permit Regulation (9 VAC 25-32-10 et seq.) is proposed to be amended. This action is necessary to reflect changes to 40 CFR Parts 9, 122, 123, and 412 as published in the Federal Register Volume 68, No. 29, dated February 12, 2003. Proposed amendments to 9 VAC 25-32 will also align this regulation with requirements specified in the VPA General Permit Regulation for Poultry Waste Management (9 VAC 25-630).

The VPA Permit Regulation contains provisions specifying permit requirements for animal feeding operations, including a general permit for animal feeding operations (AFO's) confining at least 300 animal units utilizing a liquid manure collection and storage system. A new general permit regulation 9VAC25-191 has been adopted in accordance with §62.1-44.17:1 of the Code of Virginia to regulate certain AFO's that meet the federal definition of concentrated animal feeding operation (CAFO). CAFO's will be

regulated under the Virginia Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (VDPES) permits as required by the federal CAFO rule, which became effective April 14, 2003.

The proposed action is being taken to amend 9VAC25-32 to exclude the CAFO's that will be regulated by 9VAC25-191, and to make the definitions consistent with the federal regulations.

The VPA General Permit Regulation for Poultry Waste Management (9 VAC 25-630) specifies VPA requirements for confined poultry feeding operations. Amendments to 9 VAC 25-32 are proposed that align the requirements of these two regulations.

## Legal basis

Changes were made by the U.S. EPA to 40 CFR Parts 9, 122, 123, and 412. In response to these changes, the Virginia State Water Control Board has voted to adopt amendments to the VPDES Permit Regulation (9 VAC 25-31) in accordance with §62.1-44.17:1 of the Code of Virginia that requires VPDES permits to be issued to animal feeding operations that meet the federal definition of CAFO. §62.1-44.17:1 A1. of the Code of Virginia stipulates that "notwithstanding the provisions of subsection B, the Board shall promulgate regulations requiring Virginia Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permits for confined animal feeding operations to the extent necessary to comply with §402 of the federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. §1342), as amended." Subsection B. requires VPA permits be issued to confined animal feeding operations of a size that may or may not be covered by the VPDES permits.

The proposed amendments to the VPA permit regulation (9 VAC 25-32) in response to the federal changes are discretionary in that the federal regulations do not specify that a CAFO permitted by a VPDES permit cannot also be covered by a VPA permit. However, the requirements of the VPDES permit include all of the provisions of the VPA permit, and no purpose would be served by issuing two permits to the same facility.

The proposed amendments to the VPA permit regulation (9 VAC 25-32) to align with 9 VAC 25-630 are proposed in response to § 62.1-44.17:1.1 of the Code of Virginia. This section of the law specifies that "the Board shall develop a regulatory program governing the storage, treatment and management of poultry waste".

### Purpose

The VPDES General Permit Regulation for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (9 VAC 25-31) has been amended to include requirements that VPDES permits be issued to concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFO's). CAFO's are a subset of animal feeding operations currently permitted by VPA individual or general permits. The proposed amendments to the VPA Permit Regulation (9 VAC 25-32)

will exclude CAFO's from the requirement to obtain a VPA permit, as they will be covered by a VPDES permit that provides equivalent protection of the environment.

The amendments to 9 VAC 25-32 with regard to 9 VAC 25-630 are proposed to align the VPA permit regulation requirements with those included in the poultry waste management general permit requirements.

The amendments to the VPA Permit Regulation are necessary in order to ensure clear and effective administration of the VPA permit program, thus ensuring protection of the health, safety, and welfare of citizens.

## Rationale for using fast track process

The proposed amendments are expected to be non-controversial, as the changes proposed serve only to: 1) exclude VPA permit requirements for those animal feeding operations that will be permitted by a VPDES permit and the VPDES permit will be as protective of the environment as the VPA permit, and 2) align VPA permit requirements with those that already exist in the VPA poultry waste management permit regulations.

The proposed amendments to the VPA Permit Regulation are not exempt from the Administrative Process Act as specified in § 2.2-4006 A.4.c., as the changes in the federal code make no requirements that a CAFO cannot also be permitted by a VPA permit.

#### Substance

The proposed amendments to the VPA Permit Regulation will change the definitions used to describe an animal feeding operation to be consistent with those in the federal code. The amendments will also change any reference to operations excluded from VPA requirements to include those operations required to obtain VPDES coverage.

The proposed amendments to the VPA Permit Regulation will also specify that confined poultry feeding operations are animal feeding operations that are covered by the VPA requirements. The existing regulation only specifies requirements for animal feeding operations with 300 or more animal units using a liquid manure handling system.

- 2) The primary advantage to the agency is reduction in resources necessary to administer permit requirements for a CAFO.
- 3) There are no perceived disadvantages to the public or the Commonwealth.

The proposed amendments will not affect the cost currently required to implement the existing regulation.

The proposed amendments will not affect confined poultry feeding operations, as they are already permitted by existing regulation. These amendments do not add additional requirements for these facilities.
