This amendment changes the groundwater withdrawal permit term from a maximum of 10 years to a maximum of 15 years. This amendment also changes the permit application fees for groundwater withdrawal permits. Groundwater withdrawal permit application fees will remain \$6,000 through December 31, 2018. Groundwater withdrawal permit application fees will increase to \$9,000 effective January 1, 2019. These changes are being made in response to Chapter 424 of the 2018 Acts of Assembly.

The State Water Control Board approved this amendment to Groundwater Withdrawal Regulations (9VAC25-610) and Fees for Permits and Certificates (9VAC25-20), Final Exempt Action: Amendment to change groundwater withdrawal permit term and permit fee in response to Chapter 424 of the 2018 Acts of Assembly on September 20, 2018, as a final regulation and affirmed that the Board will receive, consider and respond to requests by any interested person at any time with respect to reconsideration or revision.

This amendment changes the length of the permit term and the fee associated with groundwater withdrawal permits. There are no compliance or reporting requirements or performance standards associated with the changes being made to the regulation by this amendment. This amendment is being made in response to Chapter 424 of the 2018 Acts of Assembly. Small businesses will not be negatively impacted by the lengthening of the permit term or the changes to the permit fee. Permit terms are being lengthened to a maximum of 15 years and the permit fees are being increased in proportion to the lengthened permit term as described in §§ 62.1-44.15:6 and 62.1-266 of the Code of Virginia.
