9VAC25-760-10 Definitions.

Unless a different meaning is required by the context, the following terms, as used in this chapter, shall have the following meanings:

"Act" means the Surface Water Management Act of 1989 (§62.1-242 et seq. Of the Code of Virginia), as amended.

"Area" means the James River (Richmond Regional West) Surface Water Management Area.

"Board" means the State Water Control Board.

<u>"Surface water management area" means a geographically defined surface water area in which the Board</u> has deemed the levels or supply of surface water to be potentially adverse to public welfare, health, and <u>safety.</u>

"Surface water" means any water in the Commonwealth, except ground water as defined in §62.1-255 of the Code of Virginia.

9VAC25-760-20 Declaration of surface water management area.

A. <u>The Board hereby orders the declaration of the James River in the Richmond Metropolitan Area as a surface water management area</u>. The area shall be known as the James River (Richmond Regional <u>West) Surface Water Management Area</u>.

- B. <u>The Area shall encompass the James River upstream from the southeastern toe of the Interstate 95</u> bridge in the City of Richmond to the southwestern toe of the US Route 522 bridge in Goochland and <u>Powhatan Counties</u>. The area shall include the mainstem of the James River and all tributaries to the <u>James River and their watersheds in this river reach</u>.
- C. <u>The Board shall declare that permit conditions are applicable when the 14-day rolling average flow</u> <u>falls below 2142 cubic feet per second measured at the Cartersville James River water-stage recorder</u> <u>#02035000.</u>
- D. Permit conditions shall remain in effect until the 14-day rolling average exceeds 2142 cubic feet per second measured at the Cartersville James River water-stage recorder #02035000 for thirty consecutive days.

9VAC 25-760-30 Permits.

- All permits issued by the Board shall be issued in accordance with 9VAC25-220-10 et seq., Surface
 Water Management Areas.
- B. <u>All permits issued by the Board shall include a flow requirement appropriate for the protection of beneficial instream uses.</u>
- C. Any permit issued by the Board may include any conditions necessary to protect beneficial instream <u>uses.</u>
- D. <u>Permits issued to persons who withdraw water to support a public water supply shall at a minimum</u> contain conditions requiring the initiation of voluntary water use restrictions when the 14-day rolling average flow falls below 1428 cubic feet per second and the initiation of mandatory water use

E. Permits issued to any other persons shall at a minimum contain conditions limiting their withdrawals when the 14-day rolling average flow falls below 1428 cubic feet per second measured at the Cartersville James River water-stage recorder #02035000. The magnitude and nature of these limitations will be based on the specific beneficial use to which the withdrawal is applied.
