The Board for Contractors seeks to amend the current requirements for the approval of vocational training and continuing education providers, courses, and instructors.

#### **Purpose**

During the past two years the Board for Contractors has reviewed its education requirements for vocational training and continuing education providers. As part of a workgroup organized by the Board for the purposes of reviewing the education standards, several recommendations were made to the Board that included the regular review or course content, audit requirements, security enhancements to ensure the identity of individuals taking the courses, standardized application procedures, and other changes that would enhance the effectiveness of the requirements.

#### **Substance**

Please briefly identify and explain the new substantive provisions that are being considered, the substantive changes to existing sections that are being considered, or both.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-120 would be amended to expand the subject matter that may be approved for continuing education courses. This may include, but not be limited to, industry and trade-related classes, and OSHA safety courses.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-200 would be amended to include requirements for applying to the Board for Contractors for approval of vocational training courses and the registration of courses that are provided by organizations and schools that are accredited by outside organizations, such as the Department of Education, Virginia Apprenticeship Council, American Society of Sanitary Engineers, U.S. Department of Energy, and other similar groups. The Board will be adding an application fee to this section.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-210 would be amended to include updated requirements for applying to the Board for Contractors for approval of continuing education providers, including standardized application procedures, required documentation, instructor requirements and the addition of an application fee to this section.

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Section 18 VAC 50-30-220 would be amended to expand course offerings, provide standardized application procedures, the addition of an application fee, course expiration dates, renewal requirements, as well roster integrity requirements.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-230 would be amended to clarify the electronic roster reporting requirements to include changes that were made with the implementation of secure server equipment.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-240 would be amended to include additional site requirements such identification checks, posting of registrations, conduct documents, rescheduling of students, and other logistical requirements.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-250 would be amended to include the reporting of address changes, the mandatory submission of schedule changes, the changing of approved providers, and other changes that may be determined as necessary by the Board.

Section 18 VAC 50-30-260 would be amended to amend the process for which a provider may lose approval of its class to include the same process used to discipline a licensee or certificate holder. The reasons for the withdrawal of an approval will be expanded to include integrity issues, failure report the cancelation of a class, failure to use approved providers, failure to cooperate with an audit, and other changes that may be determined as necessary by the Board.

New sections may be added in order to best facilitate the addition of fees, reporting requirements, submission of applications for approval, grounds for disapproval, course audits, renewal requirements, or other changes that may be determined as necessary by the Board.
