The Board for Barbers and Cosmetology (the Board) seeks to amend its current regulations to allow for an apprenticeship program as a means to obtain an Esthetics license. The Board also seeks to amend its current regulations to ensure they are as least intrusive and burdensome as possible, while still protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public, are clearly written and easily understandable, and are representative of the current state of affairs of the industries.
