On October 6, 2014 (79 FR 60081), the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved a request that localities (Counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, Prince William; Cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Manassas, Manassas Park) in the northern Virginia area that were designated as nonattainment for very fine particulate matter ($PM_{2.5}$) be redesignated to attainment/maintenance. The amendments (i) revise the list of maintenance areas to include northern Virginia for $PM_{2.5}$ (PAC5-20-203); and (ii) revise the list of nonattainment areas to remove northern Virginia for $PM_{2.5}$ (PAC5-20-204).

Statement of final agency action

On December 8, 2014, the State Air Pollution Control Board took final action to adopt amendments to regulations entitled Regulations for the Control and Abatement of Air Pollution, specifically, PM_{2.5}

maintenance and nonattainment areas (9VAC5-20-203 and 9VAC5-20-204). The regulatory action is to be effective as provided in the Administrative Process Act.

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The regulation amendments are exempt from the state administrative procedures for adoption of regulations contained in Article 2 of the Administrative Process Act by the provisions of § 2.2-4006 A 4 c of the Administrative Process Act because they are necessary to meet the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act and do not differ materially from the pertinent EPA regulations.

In adopting these amendments, the board affirmed that it will receive, consider and respond to petitions by any person at any time with respect to reconsideration or revision, as provided in § 2.2-4006 B of the Administrative Process Act.
