Amended regulations change regulations for nurse practitioners to specify that a person must hold a current, unrestricted license as a registered nurse in order to hold a license and practice as a nurse practitioner.

On September 18, 2007, the Board of Nursing and on October 18, 2007, the Board of Medicine adopted final amended regulations 18VAC90-30-10 et seq., Regulations Governing the Licensure of Nurse Practitioners, specifying active licensure as a registered nurse to maintain a nurse practitioner license.

Regulations are promulgated under the general authority of Chapter 24 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia. Section 54.1-2400, which provides the Boards of Nursing and Medicine the authority to promulgate regulations to administer the regulatory system and to issue inactive licenses:

§ 54.1-2400 -General powers and duties of health regulatory boards

The general powers and duties of health regulatory boards shall be:

1. To establish the qualifications for registration, certification, licensure or the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege in accordance with the applicable law which are necessary to ensure competence and integrity to engage in the regulated professions.

2. To examine or cause to be examined applicants for certification or licensure. Unless otherwise required by law, examinations shall be administered in writing or shall be a demonstration of manual skills.

3. To register, certify, license or issue a multistate licensure privilege to qualified applicants as practitioners of the particular profession or professions regulated by such board.

4. To establish schedules for renewals of registration, certification, licensure, and the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege.

5. To levy and collect fees for application processing, examination, registration, certification or licensure or the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege and renewal that are sufficient to cover all expenses for the administration and operation of the Department of Health Professions, the Board of Health Professions and the health regulatory boards.

6. To promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) which are reasonable and necessary to administer effectively the regulatory system. Such regulations shall not conflict with the purposes and intent of this chapter or of Chapter 1 (§ 54.1-100 et seq.) and Chapter 25 (§ 54.1-2500 et seq.) of this title.

7. To revoke, suspend, restrict, or refuse to issue or renew a registration, certificate, license or multistate licensure privilege which such board has authority to issue for causes enumerated in applicable law and regulations. ...

12. To issue inactive licenses or certificates and promulgate regulations to carry out such purpose. Such regulations shall include, but not be limited to, the qualifications, renewal fees, and conditions for reactivation of licenses or certificates.

Amendments are proposed in Sections 80 and 160 to clarify that in order to hold a license and practice as a nurse practitioner in Virginia, one must hold an active, current license as a registered nurse in Virginia or hold a current multistate licensure privilege as a registered nurse. Nurse practitioner licensure has always been based on the RN license, but since the Board of Nursing has adopted an inactive RN license, Chapter 30 had to be amended to ensure that it was clear that someone could not have an inactive RN license and maintain licensure as a nurse practitioner. Licensure and practice as a nurse practitioner is dependent on the foundational license as a registered nurse, and it is necessary for public health and safety to maintain a current, active license. If the RN license is suspended or revoked by the Boards, the nurse practitioner license is likewise restricted or revoked.

Amendments to Chapter 30, Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing will clarify that it is necessary to have a current, <u>active</u> license as a registered nurse in order to practice as a nurse practitioner.

1) There are no disadvantages to the public. Nurses who would request inactive RN licensure would not be actively practicing in any setting, so their inactive status would disqualify them from practicing as a nurse practitioner.

160	n/a	Sets out the conditions by which practice as a nurse practitioner is prohibited	Clarifies that practice as a nurse practitioner is prohibited if the license as a registered nurse is lapse or inactive.
