Chapter 82 of the 2016 General Assembly requires health regulatory boards to promulgate regulations to allow some volunteer service time to count towards meeting some of a licensee's continuing education requirements.

The Board has adopted proposed regulations to allow optometrists to count two hours of the 20 hours required for annual renewal to be satisfied through delivery of professional services, without compensation, to low-income individuals receiving health services through a local health department or a free clinic organized in whole or primarily for the delivery of those

services. One hour of continuing education may be credited for three hours of providing such volunteer services, as documented by the health department or free clinic.

On July 15, 2016, the Board of Optometry adopted amendments to 18VAC105-20-10 et seq., Regulations Governing the Practice of Optometry.

Regulations are promulgated under the general authority of Chapter 24 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia. Section 54.1-2400, which provides the Board of Optometry the authority to promulgate regulations to administer the regulatory system and a specific mandate of Chapter 82 of the 2016 General Assembly:

§ 54.1-2400. General powers and duties of health regulatory boards.

The general powers and duties of health regulatory boards shall be:

1. To establish the qualifications for registration, certification, licensure or the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege in accordance with the applicable law which are necessary to ensure competence and integrity to engage in the regulated professions.

2. To examine or cause to be examined applicants for certification or licensure. Unless otherwise required by law, examinations shall be administered in writing or shall be a demonstration of manual skills.

3. To register, certify, license or issue a multistate licensure privilege to qualified applicants as practitioners of the particular profession or professions regulated by such board.

4. To establish schedules for renewals of registration, certification, licensure, and the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege.

5. To levy and collect fees for application processing, examination, registration, certification or licensure or the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege and renewal that are sufficient to cover all expenses for the administration and operation of the Department of Health Professions, the Board of Health Professions and the health regulatory boards.

6. To promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) *that* are reasonable and necessary to administer effectively the regulatory system, *which shall include provisions for the satisfaction of board-required continuing education for individuals registered, certified, licensed, or issued a multistate licensure privilege by a health regulatory board through delivery of health care services, without compensation, to low-income individuals receiving health services through a local health department or a free clinic organized in whole or primarily for the delivery of those health services.* Such regulations shall not conflict with the purposes and intent of this chapter or of Chapter 1 (§ 54.1-100 et seq.) and Chapter 25 (§ 54.1-2500 et seq.).

The purpose of the amended regulation is compliance with the mandate of the General Assembly and to provide an incentive for licensees to volunteer professional services to free clinics or public health centers. While a licensee can satisfy two hours of continuing education with six hours of volunteer service, he or she is still required to have 18 hours of approved continuing education necessary to acquire new knowledge and skills. Therefore, public health is served by a potential increase in badly-needed volunteer service for health care; but public safety is not sacrificed by eliminating most or all of the continuing education hours required for renewal.

Rationale for using fast-track process

The allowance of hours for volunteer service to be counted towards the continuing education requirement is a mandate of the General Assembly. A licensee is not required to provide volunteer service but may be credited with continuing education hours for doing so. The provision is permissive and not controversial.

To comply with the mandate of Chapter 82 of the 2016 General Assembly, the Board has adopted proposed regulations to allow optometrists to count two hours of the 20 hours required for annual renewal to be satisfied through delivery of professional services, without compensation, to low-income individuals receiving health services through a local health department or a free clinic organized in whole or primarily for the delivery of those services. One hour of continuing education may be credited for three hours of providing such volunteer services, as documented by the health department or free clinic.

- 1) The advantage to the public is the incentive given for optometrists to volunteer their services in exchange for credit towards meeting continuing education requirements. There are no disadvantages.

The Board is authorized under 54.1-2400 to "promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ <u>2.2-4000</u> et seq.) which are reasonable and necessary to administer effectively the regulatory system." Given that the Board has a statutory mandate to promulgate a regulation for CE credit for volunteer hours, it selected the alternative that would achieve the essential purpose of encouraging volunteering while not substantially reducing the amount of continuing education necessary to improve and maintain competency.
