The purpose of this regulatory action is to carry out the mandate of chapter 728 of the 2011 Acts of Assembly, which amended §§ 4.1-111 and 4.1-232 of the Code of Virginia to require that the board promulgate regulations that "prescribe the schedule of proration for refunded license taxes to licensees who qualify pursuant to subsection C of § 4.1-232." This subsection requires the board to prorate license fees when a licensed place of business is destroyed by natural disaster.

Subdivision B 11 of Section 4.1-111 and subsection C of Section 4.1-232, Code of Virginia, as adopted in Chapter 728 of the 2011 Acts of Assembly require the board to promulgate regulations to establish a schedule for proration of license fees in the event a licensed business is destroyed by natural disaster, but the details are discretionary with the board.

The proposed regulatory action is essential to protect the welfare of citizens by providing a means to protect them from the total loss of unused license fees when natural disaster prevents them from exercising the privileges of a license.

It is anticipated that this action will amend Chapter 70 by the addition of a new 3 VAC 5-70-95, providing a schedule of the percentage of the license fee that will be refunded to a licensee whose place of business is destroyed by natural disaster. The percentage will vary depending on when in the course of the license year the destruction occurs.
