The Department of Forestry is submitting its second proposed regulation amendment to allow the lawful carry of open and concealed firearms on Virginia's State Forests. The difference between the initial proposed regulation amendment and this reproposed amendment is the lifting of the prohibition against the lawful open carry firearms. The intent of this amendment is to insure this State Forest regulation is in synchronization with laws.

Current State Forest regulations prohibit individuals from carrying any firearms onto State Forest properties unless exempted because of lawful hunting seasons. The proposed amendment would allow persons to carry lawful open and concealed firearms onto State Forest properties under the ownership and management of the Department of Forestry.

10.1-1101 (General Powers and Duties of the Department) provides the authority to the Department of Forestry, with the approval of the State Forester, to promulgate regulations necessary or incidental to the performance of duties or execution of powers conferred under the Chapter.

Purpose

The Virginia Citizens' Defense League petitioned the Department of Forestry for a ruling to amend 4VAC10-30-170 and eliminate the prohibition against both open carried handguns and concealed handguns. DOF completed its response to the petition and began the process of amending its regulation, with the intent of removing the prohibition against lawful concealed firearms and continuing the prohibition on open carried firearms. DOF completed the NOIRA and first Public Comment stages. DOF received 1926 comments during the NOIRA stage and 2409 comments supporting the amendment. Based on the volume of comments from the first Public Comment stage (February 15, 2010 through April 16, 2010) supporting the lawful carrying of both open and concealed firearms on State Forests and a review of Virginia statutes, DOF is proposing a second public comment stage and a new proposed regulation to allow the lawful carrying of open and concealed firearms on State Forests.

Substance

The agency will change its regulation which currently prohibits the carrying of firearms onto State Forests, except for lawful hunting, to allow persons to carry lawful open – carried and concealed firearms onto State Forests.

- 1) The Virginia Citizens Defense League requested the Department of Forestry amend 4VAC10-30-170 to lift the prohibition against carrying lawfully open – carried and concealed firearms on the State Forests.
- 2) During the first public comment phase February 15, 2010 through April 16, 2010, DOF received a large number of comments in support of both lawful carrying of open and concealed firearms on State Forests. DOF will initiate actions for a second public comment period of thirty days to reflect a regulatory amendment that will allow the lawful carrying of both open and concealed firearms.
- 3) Upon approval of this regulatory amendment, persons may carry lawful open – carried and concealed firearms onto State Forests at any time.

The nineteen State Forests are currently located in the counties of Appomattox, Bedford, Buckingham, Carroll, Craig, Cumberland, Essex, Fauquier, Grayson, King & Queen, King William, Lancaster, Nelson, New Kent, Prince Edward, Prince William, Russell, Shenandoah, Sussex and Washington.
