The mandatory continuing education program is mandatory pursuant to § 54.1-603.1 of the Code of Virginia. In addition, § 54.1-602 provides the Board with its broad authority to establish regulations in order to obtain and retain licenses.

The Board will develop regulations to implement the continuing education program in accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-603.1 of the Code of Virginia which are as follows:

§ 54.1-603.1. Continuing education.

A. The Board shall promulgate regulations governing continuing education requirements for auctioneers licensed by the Board. Such regulations shall require the completion of the equivalent of at least six hours of Board-approved continuing education courses for any license renewal or reinstatement. The Board shall establish criteria for continuing education courses including, but not limited to (i) content and subject matter of continuing education courses, (ii) curriculum of required continuing education courses, (iii) standards and procedures for the approval of courses, course sponsors, and course instructors, (iv) methods of instruction for continuing education courses completed by an auctioneer pursuant to a requirement of the Certified Auctioneer's Institute or participation in the educational programs sponsored by the National Auctioneer's Association or Virginia Auctioneer's Association shall satisfy the continuing education requirement of this section.

B. The Board may grant exemptions or waive or reduce the number of continuing education hours required in cases of certified illness or undue hardship.

The public and the Commonwealth should be better served as licensed auctioneers will have to show compliance with the Board's continuing education requirements which should result in auctioneers being better educated and, therefore, less of a threat to the public due to inadequate knowledge. However, the cost of complying with the new requirements will most likely be passed on by licensed auctioneers to their customers.

Fiscal Impact of Proposed Regulation

Summary:

All costs incurred in support of board activities and regulatory operations are paid by the department and funded through fees paid by applicants and licensees. All boards within the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation must operate within the Code provisions of the Callahan Act (54.1-113), and the general provisions of 54.1-201. Each regulatory program's revenues must be adequate to support both its direct costs and a proportional share of agency operating costs. The department allocates costs to its regulatory programs based on consistent, equitable, and cost-effective methodologies. The board has no other source of income.

Description of Costs:

- One-Time: Costs to be incurred in FY05 include \$1,500 for court reporters for public hearings, \$5,000 for printing and mailing of applications, notifications for public participation guidelines, and regulations, and \$25,000 for systems development. The Board is expected to experience a one-time reduction in revenue of approximately \$15,000 in FY06 as a result of this regulatory change.
- Ongoing: There are no ongoing costs associated with the proposed regulations.

Cost to Localities: None anticipated.

Description of Individuals, Businesses, or Other Entities Impacted:

Estimated Number of Regulants: Approximately 1,400 individuals licensed as auctioneers. The board estimates that as many as 430 regulants would choose to give up their license as a result of this regulatory requirement.

Projected Cost to Regulants: The Board has adequate cash balances to absorb the one-time costs and potential decrease in revenues without increasing the cost to be licensed. No changes to licensing fees are anticipated as a result of this regulatory change.
