The Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq. of the Code of Virginia) requires contracts to be negotiated.
18VAC25-21- 110 Shields Jones Virginia Auctioneers Association	Commenter opposes the proposed regulations regarding the language. Proposed regulations make it difficult to provide the service at the time of the contract.	The Board does not concur with the specific changes; however, the Board believes the wording in this section can be clarified to better protect the seller while not overly burdening the auctioneer.
