Enter statement here: The Virginia Amusement Device Regulations govern the installation, maintenance and operation of amusement devices commonly found at carnivals and large amusement/theme parks. These proposed regulations update to new industry consensus standards; increase permit inspection fees for the first time in 10 years to keep up with inflation and the localities costs for conducting these safety inspections; requires the operators to provide the inspectors with copies of maintenance and safety bulletins; and, for the first time provide for inspections of inflatable amusement devices and artificial climbing walls by national recognized standards.

Enter statement here: These regulations ensure that amusement device rides are maintained and erected in a manner that ensures the safety of the public who enjoy the rides. The regulation also provides for local enforcement and ensures that code enforcement personnel are properly trained and certified to perform their inspection duties. The proposed regulations update to new national consensus standards providing for the best practices in the construction, installation, maintenance and inspections of amusement device rides and also identify safety issues and measures necessary for correcting any unsafe conditions or equipment. New amusement device rides constantly are developed and put into operation and this proposed regulation covers two new amusement devices for inflatable structures and artificial climbing walls and adopts national standards on their operation and necessary inspections. Finally, the proposed regulations allow localities to charge modest fee increases last adjusted 10 years ago.
