The Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation, in response to the Governor's regulatory reform initiative, seeks to review and amend its current regulations to repeal regulations that are unnecessary or no longer in use; and reduce unnecessary regulatory burdens on individuals, and other regulated groups.

"Promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) which implement the federal Professional Boxing Safety Act of 1996 (15 U.S.C. § 6301 et seq.) and protect the

public against incompetent, unqualified, unscrupulous or unfit persons engaging in the activities regulated by this chapter.

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"The regulations shall include requirements for (i) initial and renewal licensure, (ii) licensure and conduct of events, (iii) standards of practice for persons arranging, promoting, conducting, supervising and participating in events, (iv) grounds for disciplinary actions against licensees, (v) records to be kept and maintained by licensees, (vi) manner in which fees are to be accounted for and submitted to the Department, and (vii) minimum health coverage for injuries sustained in a boxing match. The Department shall have direct oversight of events to assure the safety and well-being of boxers and wrestlers."
