The first change reflects a provision added to the Code of Virginia that parents and guardians may be alone with their own children in a religious exempt child day center without obtaining background checks.

The second change reflects a provision added to the Code of Virginia that a child-placing agency may approve as a foster parent an applicant convicted of statutory burglary for breaking and entering a dwelling home or other structure with intent to commit larceny, who has had his civil rights restored by the Governor, provided 25 years have elapsed following the conviction.
