This regulatory action implements recent amendments to §§ 63.2-1803, 54.1-3103.1, and 54.1-2400.6 of the Code of Virginia by the 2011 Session of the General Assembly (Chapters 609 and 463, 2011 Acts of Assembly). A regulatory change allows an assisted living facility to be operated for 150 days by an acting administrator who has applied for licensure, with a possible 30 day extension when awaiting the results of the national exam. Facilities are limited to operating with an acting administrator one time during any two-year period unless authorized otherwise by the Department of Social Services. Another regulatory change provides that an assisted living facility administrator report to the Department of Health Professions certain information under specified circumstances about persons regulated by that department. This includes, but is not limited to, information regarding substance abuse and unethical or fraudulent conduct.

The State Board of Social Services approved the final exempt action to amend the regulation entitled Standards for Licensed Assisted Living Facilities, 22 VAC 40-72, on August 17, 2011.

Family impact

Assess the impact of this regulatory action on the institution of the family and family stability.

The institution of the family and family stability will be enhanced by this regulatory action because of the required reporting of persons regulated by the Department of Health Professions for certain problematic behaviors. Staff persons who are so reported may no longer be able to care for residents in assisted living facilities, resulting in greater protection of residents. In addition, residents may be better protected due to the limitations placed on a facility regarding how often it can be operated without a licensed administrator. Increased protection of residents will mean that families will have greater confidence in the welfare of their relatives who reside in assisted living facilities.
