Emergency Preamble

Section 9-6.14:4.1(C)(5) of the Administrative Process Act states that an "emergency situation" means: (i) a situation involving an imminent threat to public health or safety; or (ii) a situation in which Virginia statutory law, the Virginia appropriation act, or federal law requires that a regulation shall be effective in 280 days or less from its enactment, or in which federal regulation requires a regulation to take effect no later than 280 days from its effective date. The statement should also identify that the regulation is not otherwise exempt under the provisions of § 9-6.14:4.1(C)(4).

Please include a brief summary of the emergency action. There is no need to state each provision or amendment.

The 2003 General Assembly passed HB 1464 with the inclusion of the statement that the Board of Education shall promulgate regulations to implement the provisions of this act to be effective within 280 days of its enactment. This regulation is not otherwise exempt under the provisions of \$9-6.14:4.1(C)(4).

The General Assembly in House Bill 1464 amended and reenacted §§ 22.1-253.13:4 and 22.1-254.2 of the Code of Virginia relating to the creation of the general achievement diploma. §22.1-253.13:4 E. By September 1, 2003, the Board shall establish, by regulation, requirements for the award of a general achievement diploma for those persons who have (i) achieved a passing score on the GED examination; (ii) successfully completed an education and training program designated by the Board of Education; and (iii) satisfied other requirements as may be established by the Board for the award of such diploma.

§ 22.1-254.2. Testing for general educational development; eligibility; guidelines.

A. The Board of Education shall establish a program of testing for general educational development (GED) through which persons may earn a high school equivalency certificate *or a diploma as provided in subsection E of § 22.1-253.13:4*.

Note: The term "diploma candidate" is used in the emergency regulation to mean a person who may be working toward for a diploma, but who is not currently enrolled in school. This definition is consistent with the intent of the Board of Education and the enabling legislation. The text of the permanent regulations will clarify the meaning of "diploma candidate" in order to eliminate any confusion in school divisions.

The proposed regulation increases the options for individuals to earn a diploma. This could have a positive impact on the welfare of Virginians.

Alternatives

Please describe the specific alternatives that were considered and the rationale used by the agency to select the least burdensome or intrusive method to meet the essential purpose of the action.

Alternatives from the public will be given significant consideration during the review process. The Board of Education must establish, by regulation, the requirements for the general achievement diploma.

Family Impact Statement
