The 2003 General Assembly approved House Bill 1464 that amends §§22.1-253.13.4 and 22.1-254.2 of the Code of Virginia requiring the Board of Education to establish a General Achievement Diploma. The Board of Education regulations on awarding a high school diploma (8 VAC 20-200-10) states: "The awarding of a high school diploma shall be based upon statute, regulations of the Board of Education, and those requirements which may be prescribed by the local school board. Other forms of recognition shall be awarded at the discretion of the local school board."

The regulation establishes an individual's eligibility and the course/credit/assessment requirements for the diploma. It replaces emergency effective from November 4, 2003 through November 4, 2004 with very minor changes except in format.

The most relevant law governing the promulgation of these regulations is:

§22.1-253.13.4. Standard 4. Diplomas and certificates; class rankings.

"E. By September 1, 2003, the Board shall establish, by regulation, requirements for the award of a general achievement diploma for those persons who have (i) achieved a passing score on the GED examination; (ii) successfully completed an education and training program designated by the Board of Education; and (iii) satisfied other requirements as may be established by the Board for the award of such diploma."

The Board of Education is promulgating permanent regulations to replace emergency regulations effective from November 4, 2003 through November 4, 2004 under the mandatory authority granted by the above statute and the requirements of the Administrative Process Act.

Purpose

The Board of Education is promulgating permanent regulations to replace emergency regulations adopted May 28, 2003 to meet the requirements of the Administrative Process Act (APA) and newly enacted legislation. The APA says, in section 2.2-4011, that "pursuant to § 2.2-4012, such regulations shall become effective upon approval by the Governor and filing with the Registrar of Regulations." The emergency regulations are effective from November 4, 2003 through November 4, 2004. The APA requires that permanent regulations be adopted if the requirements are to continue.

The regulation is essential to protect the welfare of citizens because it defines the requirements for individuals who do not meet the requirements for other diplomas described in the *Regulations Establishing Standards for Accrediting Public Schools in Virginia* (8 VAC 20-131-10 et. seq.) or the *Regulations Governing Adult High School Programs* (8 VAC 20-30-10 et seq.) and wish to earn a General Achievement Diploma. The proposal satisfies the requirements of state law.

Rationale for using fast track process

Please explain the rationale for using the fast track process in promulgating this regulation. Please note: If an objection to the use of the fast-track process is received within the 60-day public comment period from 10 or more persons, any member of the applicable standing committee of either house of the General Assembly or of the Joint Commission on Administrative Rules, the agency shall (i) file notice of the objection with the Registrar of Regulations for publication in the Virginia Register, and (ii) proceed with the normal promulgation process with the initial publication of the fast-track regulation serving as the Notice of Intended Regulatory Action.

The rationale for using the fast-track process is that the emergency regulations expire in November 2004. The normal time frame for the promulgation of new regulations is a minimum of 18 months. Even with filing the Notice of Intended Regulation Action (NOIRA) at the same time the emergency regulations were adopted, there would be a lapse in regulatory oversight for awarding these diplomas if the fast-track process is not used.

Substance

The primary advantage to the public by adopting these regulations is that clear and concise direction is given to those who seek to earn this diploma. A secondary advantage is that this diploma provides another option to improve the status of citizens who otherwise may not have an opportunity to earn a high school diploma.

The advantage to the Commonwealth is that the promulgation of this regulation satisfies the statutory requirement imposed by the General Assembly.

There are no disadvantages to the public or the Commonwealth.
