The *Regulations Governing Pupil Transportation* were last revised in 2004. Since that time, statutory provisions have been enacted or amended. Some state and federal requirements have changed since 2004 and need to be incorporated into the regulations.

Substantive changes that are being made to the regulations include: updating definitions as determined by the 2005 and 2010 National Congress on Pupil Transportation; changes in maintenance requirements, changes in reporting requirements on accidents; clarifying the language on pre-trip inspections, training, records retention, reviewing of routes, and operational assessments. Language has been added on prohibiting driving more than thirteen hours in a twenty-four hour period per the Code of Virginia. The Preventive Maintenance Manual and the Physical form have been revised based on the changes to the regulations.

The Board of Education approved the proposed *Regulations Governing Pupil Transportation* at its September 23, 2010, meeting and granted approval for the Department of Education to continue through the Virginia Administrative Process Act to promulgate these regulations.

Article VIII, §4, Constitution of Virginia; Code of Virginia §22.1-176; 22.1-177; 22.1-178; 22.1-181; and 22.1-186.

The scope of legal authority is defined by Article VIII, §4, Constitution of Virginia which vests in the Board of Education the general supervision of the public school system.

Section 22.1-16, http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+22.1-16, Code of Virginia, authorizes the Board to promulgate "such regulations as may be necessary to carry out its powers and duties...."

Section 22.1-177, http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+22.1-177, Code of Virginia, gives the Board general authority to make regulations relating to the construction, design, operation, equipment and color of public school buses and the authority to issue an order prohibiting the operation on public streets and highways of any public school bus which does not comply with such regulations.

Section 22.1-176, http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+22.1-176, and §22.1-186, http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+22.1-186, Code of Virginia, authorizes the Board to promulgate regulations relating to fees for school transportation.

Section 22.1-178, http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+22.1-178, Code of Virginia, additionally sets forth requirements for school bus drivers and authorizes the Board to furnish forms to school divisions to obtain information from applicants for employment as school bus drivers as required in statute.

Purpose

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The *Regulations Governing Pupil Transportation* are being revised to address new state laws passed since 2004, as well as new federal requirements and national standards. Current state law does not require students to ride public school buses. The revision of these regulations will help to ensure the safety of children riding public school buses. Providing safe, free transportation to and from public school for children in Virginia will reduce the need for parents to transport their children.

Substantive changes to the existing regulations include:

- 1. Definitions have been updated to conform to those in the 2005 and 2010 National School Transportation Specifications and Procedures document.
- 2. Requirements for school activity buses are clarified.
- 3. Language has been included prohibiting driving more than thirteen hours in a twenty-four hour period per Section 46.2-812, *Code of Virginia*.
- 4. Changing the restriction on standees on school buses.
- 5. Language has been included to change maintenance inspections of buses from every 30 operating days or 2,500 miles to every 45 school days or 5,000 miles.
- 6. Language has been included regarding the operational assessments conducted by the Department of Education.
- 7. Language has been included to eliminate the reporting of minor bus crashes by divisions and to begin the posting of crash data on the Department of Education web site.
- 8. Language has been added to review bus routes as changes occur.
- 9. Language has been included on the use of non-sequential lighting system use at railroad crossings.
- 10. Language has been included on transporting disabled children attending special education programs.
- 11. Language has been included on records retention for pupil transportation records.
- 12. Language has been included providing further explanation of training and including new transportation directors in this training.
- 13. Language has been included for instructors to meet the requirements of a school bus driver and to have maintained a Class B license for two years.
- 14. Language has been included providing further explanation of what should be covered in in-service training.
- 15. Language has been clarified on pre-trip safety inspections and the procedure has been outlined in the Preventive Maintenance Manual.
- 16. The Preventive Maintenance Manual has been updated to reflect the changes in the maintenance of school buses and activity buses.

17. Language has been added to the Physical form outlining duties that may be required of school bus drivers.

The *Regulations Governing Pupil Transportation* are being revised to improve the safety and efficiency for children riding public school buses, and to clarify conflicting or unclear language, and to conform requirements to existing state law, federal requirements, and national standards. The following list summarizes some of the changes being made to the regulations.

- 1. The Code of Virginia, Section 46.2-812, requires that no person shall drive any motor vehicle on the highways of the commonwealth for more than thirteen hours in any period of twenty-four hours, or for a period which, when added to the time such person may have driven in any other state, would make an aggregate of more than thirteen hours in any twenty-four hour period. This would ensure school bus drivers are not driving more hours than are safe when transporting students. The proposed changes conform the regulations to this statute.
- 2. Changes to instruction for transportation directors and drivers are included. The requirement to have new transportation directors attend the "Train the Trainer" class will provide them with an overview of what is required of bus drivers. Topics for training and in-service are included to assist school divisions in providing appropriate training in various areas.
- 3. The use of the non-sequential lighting system is different from the lighting system on older buses, especially at railroad crossings. The use of the non-sequential lighting system will be covered in training sessions each year. The proper use of this lighting system will eliminate the confusion improper use may cause motorists.
- 4. Changes to the maintenance inspection schedule have been researched and discussed with bus manufacturers. Changing the schedule to every 45 school days or 5,000 miles will eliminate some of the inspections being performed by school divisions, thereby realizing some cost savings. However, this change should not reduce the safety of the school buses.
- 5. The reporting of accidents involving school buses is being revised so that school divisions only report accidents to the Department of Education that involve injuries or over \$1,500 in property damage. Not requiring the reporting of accidents with no injuries

and less than \$1,500 in property damage will save time for the local school division in reporting accidents to the state.

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6. Language allowing school divisions to have 30 instructional days to eliminate standees on school buses is being revised to require school divisions to have a local policy on this issue, but with standing allowed only under emergency conditions and for short distances. This change is in line with practices in other states.

It is not anticipated that the proposed revisions to the regulations would not present any disadvantages to the school divisions or their clients.

A yellow school bus may have a white roof provided such vehicle is painted in accordance with regulations and

specifications of the Department of Education. Note: This definition includes school buses owned and operated by school boards, private contractors, local governments, and transit systems that are used for the transportation of public school pupils. "Specially equipped bus" means a school bus designed, equipped, or modified to accommodate students with special needs. "Type A school bus" means a van conversion or bus constructed utilizing a cutaway front-section vehicle with a left side driver's door. The entrance door is behind the front wheels. This definition includes two classifications. Type A1, with a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) less than or equal to 10,000 of 14,500 pounds or less; and Type A2, with a GVWR greater than 10,000 14,500 pounds, but less than or equal to 21,500 pounds. "Type B school bus" means a bus with a body constructed utilizing a stripped chassis. The entrance door is behind the front wheels. This definition includes two classifications: Type B1, with a GVWR less than or equal to of 10,000 pounds or less; and Type B2, with a GVWR greater than 10,000 pounds. Regulatory flexibility analysis

Please describe the agency's analysis of alternative regulatory methods, consistent with health, safety, environmental, and economic welfare, that will accomplish the objectives of applicable law while minimizing the adverse impact on small business. Alternative regulatory methods include, at a minimum: 1) the establishment of less stringent compliance or reporting requirements; 2) the establishment of less stringent schedules or deadlines for compliance or reporting requirements; 3) the consolidation or simplification of compliance or reporting requirements; 4) the establishment of performance standards for small businesses to replace design or operational standards required in the proposed regulation; and 5) the exemption of small businesses from all or any part of the requirements contained in the proposed regulation.

Crash Reporting (8VAC20-70-140) will eliminate the reporting of all incidents, such as hitting mirrors, backing into something, hitting mailboxes, etc. Reports will have to be filed with the Department of Education on any crash that involves \$1,500 or more property damage or injuries.

Maintenance Inspection (8VAC20-70-130) extends the time period for maintenance inspections from every 30 operating days or 2,500 miles to every 45 school days or 5,000 miles. This should reduce the number of inspections done per year providing cost savings to school divisions.

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Family impact

Neither current law nor the pupil transportation regulations require Virginia students to ride public school buses. However, to the extent that students ride public school buses, these regulations will provide standards and requirements to help ensure the safety of children.

Several changes will increase the safety of school buses, thus further ensuring the safety of children being transported to and from public schools and promoting family well-being. There is no negative impact on the welfare of the family.

The provision of safe, free transportation to and from public school can provide economic assistance to parents by eliminating the need for parents to transport their children to and from school.
