The Board of Education received the proposed revised *Regulations Governing Local School Boards and School Divisions* for first review on January 10, 2013, with final approval on February 28, 2013.

The changes in the regulations would require local school boards that opt to use a textbook that has not been approved by the Board of Education to conduct a local textbook review that includes components similar to the state level review. Such components include a correlation with the Standards of Learning for the particular subject area, if they exist, and a review of strengths and weaknesses in instructional planning and support. Additionally, the publisher of the textbook must certify the accuracy of the content of the textbook and sign an agreement to correct all factual and editing errors found in a textbook, at its expense. Finally, the publisher must certify that the books meet other requirements of the *Code of Virginia* related to textbooks.
