VOSH PROGRAM DIRECTIVE: 02-013

SUBJECT: Compliance Policy for Emergency Action Plans and Fire Prevention Plans

A. Purpose.

This directive transmits to field personnel a consolidated compliance policy for the application of emergency action plans (EAPs) and fire prevention plans (FPPs) for General Industry Standard, Part 1910.38.

This Program Directive is an internal guideline, not a statutory or regulatory rule, and is intended to provide instructions to VOSH personnel regarding internal operation of the Virginia Occupational Safety and Health Program and is solely for the benefit of the program. This document is not subject to the Virginia Register Act or the Administrative Process Act; it does not have general application and is not being enforced as having the force of law.

B. <u>Scope</u>.

This directive applies to all VOSH personnel.
