The Virginia Lottery Gaming Compliance Committee met on March 19, 2024, at 9 a.m. at Lottery Headquarters in Richmond, Va.

Chief Gallop, chairman, presided, and Jo Murphy was the recording secretary.

Call to Order

Chief Gallop called the meeting to order and noted that a quorum was present.

Minutes

On motion duly made by Mr. Hamid and seconded by Mr. Comer, the committee recommended that the Board approve the minutes from the Gaming Compliance Committee meeting held on December 19, 2023, as presented.

Appeals Process

Ms. Dilworth provided an overview of the Gaming Compliance licensing appeals process. A recent appeal that we thought would come before the Board did not materialize. Ms. Smith provided several reasons why licenses are denied. Ms. Dilworth said that she has not yet seen a situation where there was not a well-based recommendation for denial. She also provided an overview of consent agreements. Ms. Dilworth explained that violations in other states become material fact if action was taken on a Virginia licensee. There are violations that an individual licensee might commit, but there also are violations committed by licensed operators of a casino. The appeals process is the same. If an appeal comes before the Board, she will review the process again.

Board Member Gaming 101 Discussion
