Proposed Tattooing Regulations Update

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The proposed regulations are currently under review by the Secretary of Commerce and Trade (SCT). If approved by the SCT, the regulations go to the Governor. If approved by the Governor, the proposed regulations are published in the *Virginia Register* and the 60-day public comment period is scheduled.
