The Virginia Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators and Onsite Sewage System Professionals (Board) met virtually via Google Meet on January 14, 2021, at 9:30 a.m. Board staff was present at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), 9960 Mayland Drive, Richmond, Virginia 23233. The meeting was held virtually due to the current public health emergency related to COVID-19 declared by the Governor, which made it impracticable or unsafe for the Board to assemble in a single location. The purpose of meeting was to discuss or transact business statutorily required or necessary to continue operations of the rollowing a Board.

Ms. Pruett, Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Call to Order

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board of procedures in place for Virtual Board conducting the meeting virtually.

After review and discussion, Mr. Fore moved to adopt the Board response to the public comment. Mr. Riggleman seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Brockwell, Cooke, Duncan, Evans, Ewing, Fore, Pruett, Riggleman, Roadcap, Staples, and Taylor.

Mr. Staples moved to retain the current Board regulations as is. Mr. Fore seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Brockwell, Cooke, Duncan, Evans, Ewing, Fore, Pruett, Riggleman, Roadcap, Staples, and Taylor.

Mr. Haughwout and Ms. Henshaw presented the Board with one public comment received during the public comment period of the periodic review of the Onsite Sewage System Professionals Licensing Regulations, as well as a draft Board response to the public comment for consideration.

Discussion was held on the Board's jurisdiction over unlicensed practitioners. Ms. Broz-Vaughan gave a brief overview of the statutory authority and the agency's policy regarding the issuing of cease and desist notices to unlicensed practitioners. Per the Board's request, Ms. Henshaw advised that an overview of the policy would be provided at the next Board meeting.

After review and discussion, Mr. Fore moved to adopt the Board response to the public comment. Mr. Ewing seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Brockwell, Cooke, Duncan, Evans, Ewing, Fore, Pruett, Riggleman, Roadcap, Staples, and Taylor.

Mr. Evans moved to retain the current Board regulations as is. Mr. Ewing seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Brockwell, Cooke, Duncan, Evans, Ewing, Fore, Pruett, Riggleman, Roadcap, Staples, and Taylor.

Ms. Henshaw asked the Board to consider amending current licensing fees in order to remain in compliance with the Callahan Act. After review and discussion of three options for fee amendments, Mr. Fore moved to authorize staff to decrease initial application fees and license upgrade fees from \$100.00 to \$85.00, and increase renewal fees from \$80.00 to \$105.00. In addition, reinstatement fees would increase from \$25.00 to \$35.00. Mr. Taylor seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Brockwell, Cooke, Duncan, Evans, Ewing, Fore, Pruett, Riggleman, Roadcap, Staples, and Taylor.

Ms. Pettus provided an update on the 2020 onsite sewage system professionals CPE audit. The audit began on October 7, 2020, based on a random selection of 5% of current licensees.

Ms. Henshaw provided the Board with waterworks and wastewater works examination statistics from January 1, 2017 through January 3, 2021, as well as onsite examination statistics from January 1,

Examination Updates

2017 to December 31, 2020, and July 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020.

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that subject matter expert (SME) reviews of the 2019 modifications to the 2017 standardized ABC exams for waterworks operators and 2019 modifications to the 2017 standardized ABC exams for wastewater works operators were recently held. After review, the committees of SMEs recommended that the modified exams be implemented in Virginia. Ms. Webster confirmed that the updated exams are now live. Ms. Webster advised the Board that revisions suggested during the respective reviews have been forwarded to ABC for consideration.

Ms. Henshaw reminded the Board of temporary waivers of certain regulations pursuant to Executive Order 51 in response to COVID-19. During the current state of emergency, the validity of licenses, certifications, registrations, and other authorizations issued by the Board that would otherwise (i) expire during the state of emergency DRAFT AC Naterials and (ii) be eligible for renewal or reinstatement during the state of emergency under applicable regulations, will be extended until the 30th day after the date by which the state of emergency is lifted. In addition, regulations that prohibit or limit online, electronic, or distance learning have also been waived until the 30th day after the date by which the state of emergency is lifted. Ms. Henshaw noted that the waivers do not apply to statutory requirements.

> In addition, Ms. Henshaw advised the Board of a recent waiver that waives any regulatory requirement that a licensee be physically present at a place of business.

> Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that the agency remains closed to the public and staff scheduling adjustments remain in place, including telework for those employees who are eligible.

Ms. Henshaw provided the Board with the most recent financial statements for review.

Ms. Henshaw updated the Board on recent and upcoming virtual outreach opportunities.

Ms. Broz-Vaughan reminded Board members to complete their Other Business annual conflict of interest and financial disclosures.

Mr. Riggleman inquired about wall certificates for operator licensees who have upgraded in class. In the past wall certificates have stated the class of license; however, currently the wall certificates do not

list the class of license. Ms. Henshaw advised that this due to the way in which license information is stored in the agency's database that is responsible for printing the certificates. Ms. Henshaw advised that she hopes to address this issue when the database is replaced later in the year.

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that the final report on the study being conducted to determine the need of continued regulation of various professions, including soil scientists and backflow prevention device workers, as recommended by the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) has been finalized and submitted to the General Assembly for review and consideration.

Ms. Henshaw reminded the Board that staff actively monitors legislation throughout General Assembly session and provides data and information regarding the Board and Department relevant to legislative proposals affecting the Board. Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that the 2021 General Assembly session began on January 13, 2021, and provided an update of legislative proposals that could affect DPOR and the Board.

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that public health workers are included in Phase 1C of COVID-19 vaccination efforts, and that wastewater workers are specifically mentioned in the latest iteration of vaccination phases.

Materiale

Ms. Henshaw asked the Board to consider authorizing staff to develop a form for onsite sewage system professionals from other states applying for licensure in Virginia that would provide for an explanation of the out-of-state experience gained and a description of the out-of-state facility in which the applicant gained the experience. This form would be similar to the Out-of-State Facility Description & Experience Verification form currently used by water and wastewater works operator applicants. Ms. Henshaw asked the Board to consider forming a committee of SMEs to address areas specific to onsite occupations and facilities that should appear on the form, as well as other topics that Board staff may identify related to application processing and licensing. . Mr. Fore moved that Board members Brockwell, Ewing, and Pruett serve on the committee. Mr. Riggleman seconded the motion which was approved by: Brockwell, Cooke, Duncan, Evans, Ewing, Fore, Riggleman, Roadcap, Staples, and Taylor.

The OSSP Committee of the Virginia Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators and Onsite Sewage System Professionals (Board) met on March 30, 2021, at the offices of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, 2nd Floor, Board Room 4, Richmond, Virginia 23233.

Pettus, Admini Mr. Ewing called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. **Call to Order** Ms. Lindsey advised the Board of the emergency evacuation Emergency procedures. **Evacuation Procedures** Ms. Lindsey reminded the Committee of safety measures currently in COVID-19 Safety place due to COVID-19. **Reminders** Ms. Pruett moved to approve the agenda as presented. Mr. Brockwell **Approval of Agenda** seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Brockwell, Ewing, and Pruett. There were no member of the public present at the meeting. **Public Comment** Period Ms. Lindsey provided an overview of the responsibilities before the **Overview** Committee. The Board formed the Committee to review current staff procedures for processing applications for licensure and ensuring licensee compliance with the Board's regulations. Ms. Lindsey introduced to the Committee Lisa Robinson, Licensing Operations Administrator.

Ms. Lindsey also provided the Committee with a breakdown of entry requirements for each onsite license type?

Ms. Lindsey asked the Committee to consider the technical duties performed by onsite sewage system professionals for the purpose of amending the current out-of-state experience verification form to reflect specific tasks that qualify as valid experience in Virginia.

Discussion on Reciprocity/Out-of-State Experience Verification

Discussion was held on whether pumpers should be required to qualify as alternative operators.

After review of the current out-of-state experience verification form and experience forms used by other DPOR boards wherein a series of check boxes are used to convey an applicant's experience, the Committee agreed by consensus that the check box format should not be limited to the out-of-state experience verification form, and should be used on all experience forms.

The Committee reviewed experience requirements from neighboring conventions and job titles, as well as regulatory bodies. Discussion was also held on who would qualify to sign the experience verification form and verify an applicant's experience.

The Committee worked to compile a list of specific tasks performed by each onsite license type to include on onsite experience verification forms.

The Committee recessed from 11:33 a.m. to 12:19 p.m.

Discussion continued on specific tasks performed by each onsite license type, including the differences between alternative and conventional licenses.

Discussion was held on language that should be included on the out-ofstate experience verification form regarding compliance with statutory code and regulations.

Discussion was held on equivalent verifiers for out-of-state experience verification forms and who would qualify to sign and verify an out-ofstate applicant's experience.

Discussion was held on current qualifications for the master Review Current designation, as there is currently no time frame in which an individual Application Processes

who receives a journeyman license must wait to apply for a master license. Ms. Lindsey advised that the matter will be a topic to be considered during the next general review of licensing regulations.

Ms. Lindsey advised the Committee that the Board for Contractors has begun a regulatory action to convert the Sewage Disposal System (SDS) specialty into two categories, SDS-Alternative (SSA) and SDS-Conventional (SSC), in order to align the license of the Qualified Individual to the type of license held from the WWWOOSSP Board. Ms. Lindsey then asked the Committee to consider whether the highway/heavy contractor designation should still be accepted to meet entry requirements for onsite licensure. After discussion, the Committee agreed by consensus that the highway/heavy contractor designation is not accepted as a qualification for license; however, the SDS designations will continue to be accepted.

Ms. Lindsey advised the Committee that staff will work to amend the OSSP experience verification forms as discussed, and would distribute the amended forms to the Committee for review. As the forms are developed internally based on licensing staff processes, Boardapproval of the forms is not necessary.

Naterials

The Committee reviewed continuing professional education (CPE) audit statistics from 2017, 2018, and 2020 to determine if the random selection of 5% of the OSSP regulant population is sufficient for annual CPE audits. The Committee agreed by consensus that staff will continue conducting annual CPE audits on 5% of the regulant population.

Mr. Ewing discussed the possibility of adding seats to the Board in **Other Business** order to offer more representation of the OSSP industry, as it is currently difficult for Board members in OSSP seats to consider or vote on disciplinary matters because they are often required to recuse themselves based on their participation in the technical review or informal fact finding stages of the complaint or licensing review process. This is of particular concern due to the unprecedented growth the industry has seen over the past year as a result of more people staying at home during the pandemic. Ms. Lindsey advised that this would require a legislative change and that the matter would be put before the Board for further discussion.

Mr. Ewing reminded the Committee members to complete their conflict of interest forms and travel vouchers.

Request for Clarification or Guidance

Sections 18VAC160-30-200 and 210 and 18VAC160-40-340, 350, and 360 of the Board's regulations provide the topic areas for earning CPE credit as a licensee of the Board. Each of these regulation sections include the following in the list of acceptable CPE topics: administrative processes and procedures applicable to licensure, and laws and regulations applicable to the profession. As it has been previously suggested that licensees can earn CPE credit for attending Board meetings but there has not been any formal guidance established regarding earning CPE credit in this manner, staff requests the following be considered by the Board.

In order to earn CPE credit for attending a WWWOOSSP Board meeting, each of the following must be met:

- A licensee of the Board must sign in and out of the Board meeting on forms provided by staff to include providing, at a minimum, the licensee's name, address, and license number(s). For virtual Board meetings, Board staff will provide instructions in advance of the Board meeting on how a licensee is to confirm attendance at the meeting and provide their identifying information.
- 2. A licensee can only earn CPE credit for attending a Board meeting once per license cycle.
- 3. CPE credit will be awarded pursuant to the provisions in the regulations, including the



calculation of a "contact hour" as 50 minutes. However, the maximum credit that can be earned for attending a Board meeting is seven (7) hours of CPE credit.

- 4. A licensee who attends a Board meeting as a participant in a disciplinary matter being considered at that meeting is not eligible to earn CPE credit for attending that Board meeting.
- 5. Board staff may request additional information or documentation to ensure compliance with these guidelines. Failure to follow these instructions, including providing all necessary information, or failure for Board staff to confirm the licensee's attendance at the Board meeting may result in CPE credit not being awarded.

In addition to the information above, it should be noted that a licensee could be subject to disciplinary action if he falsely claimed CPE credit or misrepresented his attendance at a Board meeting.

If the Board agrees with these guidelines, staff requests that the Board adopt a guidance document stipulating the requirements herein, along with any amendments or additional items the Board wishes to include. In accordance with § 2.2-4002.1, such guidance will be subject to public comment before becoming effective.
