Additionally, he moved that Ms. Brown, Ms. Larimer, Mr. Opper, Ms. Pollick and Ms. Jones attend the closed meeting, because their presence in the closed meeting was deemed necessary and would aid the Committee in its

deliberations.

**RECONVENE:** Having certified that the matters discussed in the preceding closed

session met the requirements of § 2.2-3712 of the Code, the Committee reconvened in open session and announced its

recommendations.

DECISION:  ADJOURNMENT:	Upon a motion by Dr. McAdams, and duly seconded by Ms. Argow, the Committee made certain recommended Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and voted to recommend to the Board that Mr. Thomson's Master of Science degree from the Department of Psychology at Capella University does not appear to prepare individuals to practice counseling and counseling treatment interventions as defined in §54.1-3500 of the Code and that his application for licensure as a Professional Counselor be denied.
