## **ADOPTION OF AGENDA**

Patricia Cooper moved to adopt the agenda as amended. The motion was seconded, discussed and carried.

### PUBLIC COMMENTS OF AGENDA ITEMS

Alexander McCauley commented, on behalf of VOTA on proposed language 18 VAC-85-80-110, Supervisory Responsibility. Concerns were expressed by VOTA were that the language may be too restrictive for COTA's, while at the same time not be restrictive enough for less skilled occupational therapy personnel.

# **REPORT OF OFFICERS**

# **#1. Regulatory Update.**

Ms. Yeatts presented the "Board of Medicine Regulatory Actions", a handout on the proposed regulations. The proposed regulations were discussed. It was recommended that 18 VAC 85-80-110, Supervisory Responsibilities be amended to add a #3 to read as follows: "**Delegation shall only be made if, in the judgment of the occupational therapist, the tasks or procedures do not require the exercise of professional judgment, can be properly and safely performed by appropriately trained unlicensed occupational therapy personnel, and the delegation does not jeopardize the health or safety of the patient". Patricia Cooper moved to adopt the amended regulation. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously. Ms Yeatts stated that House Bill 1318 places a new exemption under § 54.1-2901 (27). This exemption would be added to the licensed occupational therapy regulations by emergency regulation. Mrs. Cooper moved to adopt the emergency regulation. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.**

The Advisory Board also discussed creating an expanded website specific to occupational therapy. Ms. Powers stated she would take the necessary steps to see what could be done.
