The board agreed that the restricted volunteer license could apply to occupational therapists and suggested the requirement of 10 hours of continued learning activity to include 5 hours of type 1.

A request for rule making was presented by VOTA and a draft of the proposed amendments was reviewed. After a lengthy discussion, Dr. Neufeld moved to consult with board counsel regarding the authority to adopt regulations on supervision and role of the occupational therapy assistant and aide. The motion was seconded and carried.

Dr. Neufeld moved to initiate a NOIRA for periodic review of regulations to include supervision. The motion was seconded and carried.
