## **CALL TO ORDER**

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Mr. Kaufman asked whether a member had any new business for the workgroup. Mr. Lessin informed members that he wishes to remove all of the restrictions that prevent charitable gaming organizations from competing with other forms of gaming authorized in the Commonwealth. Ms. Solares stated that she agreed in principle to the statement made by Mr. Lessin. Mr. Lessin further stated that he supports setting a different use of proceeds requirement on the gross receipts generated from the sales of bingo and the gross receipts generated from the sales of electronic pull-tabs in order to encourage organizations to use electronic pull-tabs during their bingo session. As such, Mr. Lessin encouraged the workgroup to consider recommending to the Board to make a public statement that the Board would not revoke or suspend a charitable gaming permit on the basis that it did not meet the use of proceeds requirement since amending the regulations could take a considerable amount of time to do so. Mr. Kaufman expressed concerns with making a public statement and Mr. Menefee advised the workgroup that it might wish to speak with the Office of the Attorney General on the legal ramifications on such a statement before doing so. Mr. Kaufman stated the workgroup would recommend starting the administrative process to amend the regulations to change the use of proceeds requirement. With no new business from any of the members, Mr. Kaufman moved onto public comment.

With no comments from the public and there being no further business, the workgroup adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
