The meeting was attended by 12 voting members, which constituted a quorum.

VDACS Giant Hogweed Update

Tina MacIntyre provided a brief update on the giant hogweed survey, identification, and treatments from 2018 and 2019. There are three positive sites in VA; one site in Clarke County, one site in Rockingham County, and one site in Fauquier County.

Review of Noxious Weed Assessments

1) Dioscorea polystachya

Chinese yam, cinnamon vine

<u>Discussion</u>: The committee reviewed the assessment and utilized the Digital Atlas of Virginia Flora and noted the plants dispersal and distribution. The plant was widely distributed in Virginia.

Motion action: Nominate to Tier 3.

Member who made the motion: Ruth Douglas Member that seconded the motion: Rod Walker

Motion passed unanimously.

2) Elaeagnus umbellata

Autumn olive, oleaster

<u>Discussion</u>: The committee discussed the hybrid *Elaeagnus* plants and the implications of adding the plant to the list. The committee verified that *Elaeagnus umbellata* was being grown and commercially sold in VA and species is therefore commercially viable in Virginia. *Elaeagnus umbellata* is not eligible for listing as a noxious weed.

Motion action: Table the discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

The committee decided to list species and subspecies only, and not include their hybrids.

3) Persicaria longiseta

Smartweed, oriental lady's thumb, Asiatic smartweed, bristled knotweed, bunchy knotweed

<u>Discussion</u>: Committee cited concerns regarding a lack of research and information on the impact of the plant, and the low impact score on the assessment.

<u>Motion action</u>: **Table discussion until next meeting**. Jim Hurley will review the assessment, research more and resubmit the assessment for the next meeting.

4) Pueraria montana

Kudzu

Discussion: No committee discussion on this weed.

Motion action: Nominate to Tier 3.

Motion passed unanimously.

5) Trapa bispinosa

Two-horned trapa, water chestnut

<u>Discussion</u>: This species has been identified as *Trapa bispinosa*, which is different than *Trapa natans* L. This new species has minimal science attributed to its impact and invasiveness. According to the Integrated Taxonomic Information System (ITIS), *T. bispinosa* is a taxonomic synonym for *T. natans* L. The available research for *T. natans* is applicable to *T. bispinosa*.

Motion action: Nominate to Tier 2.

Motion passed unanimously.

6) Ulmus pumila

Siberian elm

<u>Discussion</u>: The impact of Siberian elm was low with only limited observations of instances of invasiveness in VA. Discussion on the potential for this plant to be invasive, but there was limited evidence Siberian elm is invasive in Virginia and it does not appear to be widely distributed or spreading in the Commonwealth.

Motion action: Table discussion.

Motion passed.

Assessments that will be considered at the next meeting: Ficaria verna.

Summary:

Dioscorea polystachya - Chinese yam, cinnamon vine: Nominated to Tier 3;
Elaeagnus umbellata - autumn olive, oleaster – Discussion tabled (commercially viable);
Persicaria longiseta - Smartweed, oriental lady's thumb, Asiatic smartweed, bristled knotweed, bunchy knotweed - Table discussion until next meeting (resubmit with more information);
Pueraria montana – Kudzu – Nominated to Tier 3;

Trapa bispinosa - Two-horned trapa, water chestnut - **Nominated to Tier 2**; and *Ulmus pumila* - Siberian elm - **Discussion tabled** (*committee discussion revealed low impact*).

Action Items:

VDACS will schedule next meeting;

VDACS will update the committee on regulatory process status at next meeting;

VDACS will review a 'general permit' for Tier 3 plants;

Specific references and direct web-links to each reference should be included in future assessments;

NWAC will further discuss permitting process; and

VDOT will look into alternative seed mixes that do not contain *Lespedeza cuneata*.
