Upon a motion by Mr. Howard-Seldon and seconded by Mr. Anders, the Board voted to accept the Consent Order.

The members voting 'yes' were Mr. Anders, Mr. Do, Mr. Howard-Seldon, Mr. Quesenberry, and Ms. Weaver. There were no negative votes. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Christner provided the Board information about cases handled by the Compliance and Investigations Division.

Compliance and Investigation Division

Mr. Christner gave a synopsis on the types of complaints received and how they were resolved. Mr. Christner reported that during the two years he has been with the Agency the complaints have been generally of the same nature and there has not been a substantial increase or decrease in the number of complaints received.

Mr. Christner reported that a very large number of complaints are received anonymously which are basically problematic in two ways:

- (1) If the information provided is not specific there is no source to contact to gather additional information;
- (2) If the information is received is specific it is difficult to move forward especially regarding unlicensed activity because there are no willing participants to aid in the investigation in obtaining warrants. Additionally, Commonwealth Attorneys have required actual observation of the activity, before they would authorize the obtaining of a warrant.

Mr. Christner reported that just over 30 complaints, regulatory in nature, were brought into compliance and 20 unlicensed cases were brought into compliance.

Mr. Christner reported that the Inspection Violation Consent Agreement have proven successful. Twenty-one cases have resulted in 58 violations. Board for Barbers and Cosmetology Minutes of Meeting November 6, 2006 Page 6 of 8

Mr. Christner concluded his report by fielding questions from the Board.

The Board was informed that the Final Tattooing Regulations completed the regulatory process and went into effect October 1, 2006.

**Tattooing** Regulations

The Board was informed that the Final Hair Braiding Regulations Hair Braiding completed the regulatory process and went into effect November 1, 2006.

Regulations

The Board was informed that the Body-Piercing Regulations were in the final stage of regulatory review and are currently in the Governor's Regulations Office pending review.

**Body-Piercing** 

The Board was informed that the Proposed Esthetics Regulations were approved by the Governor and were published in the Virginia Register. Volume 23, Issue 04, Monday, October 30, 2006. The regulations are is currently in a 60-day public comment period from October 30, 2006, through December 29, 2006.

Esthetics Regulations

Public comment may be submitted in writing by mail, e-mail, fax or presented at the scheduled public hearing, Monday, December 11, 2006, 10:00 a.m., at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation, 3600 West Broad Street, Richmond, Virginia.

Persons presenting comment at the public hearing are encouraged to provide a copy of their comments in writing. Public comment must be submitted between October 30 and December 29, 2006. Comments submitted prior to October 30 must be resubmitted in order to be included in the public comment to be considered by the Board.

The Board will take no action other than receiving public comment on the proposed regulations at the public hearing. The public hearing is held to provide an opportunity for public comment to be submitted, but not for the Board to take action on the comments. The text of the proposed regulations may be accessed electronically on the Virginia Town Hall website

Ms. Sweet reported that on May 24, 2006, the National-Interstate Council of State Boards of Cosmetology, Inc. (NIC) declined their request for the development of a master esthetician practical examination stating, in part, to all the different machinery, expense, and liability that a practical examination would encompass.

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Ms. Sweet reported that an e-mail was sent to six examination service vendors to determine if a market exists for the development and administration of a master practical esthetician examination.

Only one vendor indicated interest and provided an estimate based on 1000 candidates per year for the master practical. That vendor estimated a cost of \$140 to \$160 per candidate for 1000 candidates for one exam site and \$275 to \$300 per candidate for 1000 candidates for four exam sites.

In addition, the proposed regulations require a cap on the examination fees, both written and practical of \$225.

The recommendation was that the Board change the text to provide the Board with the maximum discretion in determining the licensure requirements.

Ms. Gee and Ms. Todd volunteered to continue working with Ms. Sweet on means of determine competency.

At 10:36 a.m. the Board recessed and reconvened at 10:46 a.m.

Mr. Anders reported on the National Association of Barber Boards of National Association America 80th Annual Conference held September 23-28, 2006 in of Barber Boards of Denver, Colorado.

America 2006 Annual Conference

Ms. Anders stated the mission and the objectives of the National Association of Barber Boards of America and stated topics that were discussed this year - protecting the use of the barber pole, falsification of licensure, education, history of barbering, and preserving identity.

Mr. Anders also reported that this year's conference was dedicated in special memory of Mr. Edwin C. Jeffers, a licensed barber for over 48 years and Executive Officer and Communications office with the National Association for Barber Boards of America who died earlier this year.

Mr. Quesenberry reported the Ms. Howard-Seldon, Ms. Dugger, and he attended the National Interstate Council of State Boards of Cosmetology (NIC) 2006 Annual Conference held August 26-28, 2006, in Portland, Maine.

Mr. Quesenberry reported that the theme for NIC's 2006 Annual Conference was "Collaborative Leadership". The topics addressed Board for Barbers and Cosmetology Minutes of Meeting November 6, 2006 Page 8 of 8

were nationwide mobility - reciprocity, infection control, the regulatory review process, broadcasting live meetings, and communication/persuasion. The highlights were to promote collaboration in the regulation of cosmetology and related fields both nationally and internationally.

Mr. Quesenberry reported that Kirby Morris CEO and representative of NIC successfully established a complete Founding Board that will establish and sign agreements for the qualifications for Nail Technology, Barbering, and Cosmetology. According to Mr. Morris, the states that are participating in the NIC National Examination Program will now have endorsement into Australia, Canada, New Zealand, South Africa, South Korea, and the United Kingdom as well as the 38 states that are currently taking our candidates through endorsement.

The Board was informed that the Financial Disclosure Statement will Other Board be mailed out soon and board members are required annually to Business complete and return the forms to the board office.

Board Members were given a copy of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulations 2004-2006 biennial report.

There being no other business to be brought before the Board, the Adjourn meeting adjourned at 11:17 a.m.
