Trump, MD, MPH, MPA Office of EMS Report – Gary Brown, Director; Scott Winston, Assistant Director; George Lindbeck, MD, State EMS Medical Director & OEMS Staff	 Dr. Trump said that he was impressed with the community support he witnessed during the American College of Emergency Physicians system site visit. Dr. Trump talked about Virginia's plan for "well being," which Dr. Levine, the Virginia Health Commissioner has been charged to develop. The goal is to make Virginia the healthiest state in the nation. Mr. Brown welcomed everyone to the 36th annual Virginia EMS Symposium. Dr. Lindbeck did not have a report. Gary Brown gave the Board the dates for the 2016 EMS Advisory Board committee and board meetings: February 4-5, 2016 – EMS Advisory Board meeting is February 5 May 5-6, 2016 – EMS Advisory Board meeting is May 6 August 4-5, 2016 – EMS Advisory Board meeting is August 5 November 9, 2016 at the EMS Symposium Mr. Decker said at a recent ODEMSA meeting a concern was raised by some hospital groups as to the amount of access time that trauma centers have to access data, which is for several months as opposed to non-trauma center hospitals that only have five days to access data. Mr. Decker asked if there is a way that a non-trauma center hospital can get access to hospital data for more than five days. Mr. Sharpe explained that non-trauma center hospitals are only allowed a few days because this is enough time for those facilities to move the data into their own data systems. In contrast trauma centers are a part of the EMS mission and they are doing things that require them to

Mr. Decker was also concerned after realizing that while there are regulations requiring a prehospital agency to make available to the hospital a pre-hospital record that there is no requirement for the hospital to do anything with that record. Mr. Decker said that he has discovered that the hospitals are not bringing the pre-hospital record into the patient's medical record. He said that when hard copies were required that they were put into the patient's file; but it doesn't always happen now with the electronic data. Mr. Decker asked if this is how the system is supposed to work. Mr. Sharpe acknowledged this problem and said that they are working to educate the hospitals as to why they need to utilize the data EMS provides and also to provide data back to EMS. Mr. Sharpe said that in the future this will probably be tied to the hospitals funding. • Ms. Pearce gave a report on the ACS State Trauma System visit recommendations. She told the audience that the ACS final report should be received before the end of the year. Ms. Pearce also told the group that based on the recommendations the Trauma Oversight and Management Committee (TSOMC) will have to be restructured so that it will include all participants of the trauma system as opposed to the current committee that is very trauma center focused. Dr. McNally gave a presentation on the CARES program and how it has been implemented in several states. Dr. McNally said that in order for a state to establish a CARES program they should probably have a Coordinator and that there will also be subscription fee of \$15,000 as the CARES program transitions to private funding. Chip Decker stated that Richmond Ambulance Authority started participating in this program in 2009. He said that they are disappointed that the CARES program is no longer being publicly funded. He encouraged OEMS to try and find funding for this program, which is a very worthwhile program.
