Committee Chair Report (Mr. Gary Critzer):	In January, Ken sent out an email to get thoughts about holding the Communications Committee Meeting in Virginia Beach in conjunction with the APCO/NENA Spring Conference in May. However, it was decided against it due to committee members having to be in Glen Allen to attend other meetings. Also, the meeting room has been reserved for this meeting and would still be charged to OEMS if not used. However, it may be possible to hold one meeting per year in conjunction with the Fall APCO/NENA Conference in Roanoke. This would need to be planned ahead of time. It would be good to share information about the EMD program at that conference. If it is not feasible for this year, we will start to plan it for the Fall Conference in 2017. Ken will look into this. (Ken Crumpler):	FirstNet – First Responder Network Authority – request for subject matter experts – ref: Emergency Medical Services The National Association for EMS Officials (NASEMO) has reached out to the office for subject	
	matter experts for the FirstNet program. Mike O'Keefe briefly discussed what FirstNet is. OEMS was asked to submit names to represent EMS. Some of the names that were considered were David Hoback, Charles Warner, Lisa Dodd and Mike Harmon. Gary and Ken feel that Mike should be the	

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	one to represent EMS. Mike agreed to be the subject matter expert for NASEMSO.	
	APCO ProCHRT subcommittee –Emergency Medical Dispatch (Derrick Ruble) Mr. Ruble stated that this program consists of basic pre-arrival instructions and is not mandated in Virginia, but would like to encourage use of it by all EMD services. They also want to promote legislation that 911 is a profession of public safety and not clerical. Gary Critzer would like to know if there is a bill associated with this and if so, please give him the bill number. A conference call was held recently in which Ken attended. The subcommittee has created a list of who is not doing EMD. They will be going to the agencies that are not doing EMD to answer questions and concerns about EMD. They are working on an education plan such as a PowerPoint to help agencies better understand what is available to them and to dispel misconceptions.	
	In regard to grants, Gary stated that he understands that grants are for licensed EMS agencies only. Amanda explained that the guidance she received based on the last round of grants that were awarded, that this is not true. It is not only for licensed EMS agencies.
