In Chapters 753 and 762 of the 2003 Acts of the Assembly, § 54.1-2921 of the Code of Virginia was repealed and its provisions included in a new Code section, § 54.1-2408.2. Following that action, the Board amended Chapter 20 of its regulations to cite the new section but inadvertently left the repealed Code cite in other chapters. By this action, those chapters are amended under an exemption in the Administrative Process Act in which amendments are "necessary to conform to changes in Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act where no agency discretion is involved." (§ 2.2-4006)
