In accordance with the powers and duties of the boards, an amendment to 18 VAC 90-30-10 et seq., Regulations Governing the Licensure of Nurse Practitioners was adopted on by the Board of Nursing on November 15, 2000 and by the Board of Medicine on November 17, 2000.
