By authority granted under Section 3.2-703 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services may extend areas currently regulated for plant pests. Expansion of 2 VAC 5-330 *et seq.*, *Rules and Regulations for Enforcement of the Virginia Pest Law – Virginia Gypsy Moth Quarantine*, is now necessary due to the increase in the gypsy moth population in Wythe County.

The quarantine is intended to prevent the artificial spread of the gypsy moth, the larvae of which is a defoliator of both hard and softwood trees, from infested areas to non-infested areas in Virginia, thereby protecting the public's health and welfare.

The regulations prescribe the conditions necessitating that a regulated article moving from a regulated area within Virginia have a certificate issued by an inspector or person operating in accordance with a compliance agreement with the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Regulated articles from states where gypsy moth is present are prohibited entry into the non-regulated areas of the Commonwealth unless a certificate or permit indicating that the article is free from the gypsy moth has been issued.
