Pursuant to the 2009 Acts of the Assembly (Chapters 158 and 162), the Director of the Department of Health Professions has amended regulations relating to: 1) disclosures by prescribers that they may query the Prescription Monitoring Program for the purpose of establishing a treatment history; 2) requests for information from health care professionals designated by prescribers to request information; and 3) removal of the requirement for dispensers to hold a license as a non-resident pharmacy in order to permit interoperability among state monitoring programs.

On March 20, 2009, the Director of the Department of Health Professions acted to amend regulations in Chapter 20, *Regulations Governing the Prescription Monitoring Program* to conform requirements for disclosures and requests for information to changes in the law effected by the passage of HB2211 and SB1195. The action is exempt in the Administrative Process Act under § 2.2-4006 of the Code of Virginia.
