Clarify qualification sections. For example add specificity to the criminal conviction section and clarify time frame to submit a complete application after passing the examination.

Amend continuing education requirements to delete language regarding requirements prior to January 1, 1999.

Clarify Standards of Practice provisions regarding "place of business" and "branch office". Current provisions use these terms interchangeably without clear definition.

Review internet advertising provisions from other states and standard language provided by the Association of Real Estate License Law Officials to determine whether changes to current provisions are recommended.

Amend Standards of Conduct provisions to include potential disciplinary action for disciplinary actions in other jurisdictions. This would make the Standards of Practice provisions consistent with Qualifications provisions.

Review provisions regarding schools and courses to ensure consistency with changes to statute.

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Alternatives

Failure to adopt these changes will result in regulations not being as clear as possible, lack of regulations regarding internet advertising could have an adverse impact on the public.
