# Effectiveness

This regulation meets the criteria set out in Executive Order 14 (2010), e.g., it is necessary for the protection of public health, safety, and welfare, and is clearly written and easily understandable.

#### Result

The Department of Corrections is recommending that the regulation should stay in effect without change.

## Small business impact

Pursuant to §2.2-4007.1 E and F, the Department of Corrections has considered the economic impact of regulation 6VAC15-45 on small business. The Department of Corrections has determined (1) there is continued need for the regulation based on legal mandate; (2) the complexity of the regulation is appropriate to the subject matter; (3) the regulation does not significantly overlap, duplicate, or conflict with federal or state law or regulation; and (4) there have been no significant changes in technology, economic conditions, or other factors in the area affected by the regulation. The Department of Corrections has determined that there is no need for the regulation to be amended or repealed, consistent with the stated objectives of applicable law, to minimize the economic impact of regulations on small businesses.

## **Family impact**

This regulation covers relations between state agencies and corporate contractors and thereby has no impact on the institution of the family and family stability.
