Section 3.2-106 of the Code of Virginia (Code) authorizes the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (Department) to establish a program of financial incentives designed to encourage, expand, and develop the breeding of horses in the Commonwealth and requires the Department to adopt appropriate regulations for the administration of the program.

The regulation provides for the administration of the Virginia Horse Breeder Incentive Program. This program is part of an effort to recognize quality horse breeding in the Commonwealth and

is supported by the Virginia Horse Industry Board. The agency determined that these requirements are not unnecessarily burdensome. There is no viable alternative for the administration of this program.

The agency recommends that the regulation stay in effect without change because the Virginia Horse Breeder Incentive Program encourages the growth of the horse breeding industry in Virginia, which has a positive impact on the Virginia economy. No changes to agency or industry practices have occurred that would necessitate any modifications to the regulation.

There have been no complaints from the public concerning the regulation. The regulation is not unnecessarily complex. There is no overlap with federal or state law or regulations. The agency has determined that no changes have occurred in the area affected by this regulation since the last periodic review that would make it necessary to amend or repeal the regulation. The agency has determined that that current version of the regulation is consistent with current industry practices and is the least burdensome and least intrusive alternative.
