VIRGINIA BOARD FOR ASBESTOS, LEAD, AND HOME INSPECTORS **MEETING MINUTES**

The Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors met on February 7, 2013, at the offices of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, 2nd Floor, Board Room 4, Richmond, Virginia 23233.

Elizabeth Peay from the Office of the Attorney General was present.

Mr. Cronan, finding a quorum of the Board present, called the Call to Order meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board of the emergency evacuation Emergency procedures.

Evacuation **Procedures**

Ms. Henshaw indicated there have been some changes in staff Introduction of Staff responsibilities within the section. Tom Perry will be the Board Administrator for the ALHI Board and Jill Hrynciw will be the Board Administrator for the Common Interest Community Board. These changes are a result of efforts within the Agency to foster new ideas and perspectives in order to improve and streamline processes. Ms. Hrynciw and Mr. Perry will be working closely together during the transition.

Mr. Nixon moved to approve the agenda. Mr. Vander Pol seconded Approval of Agenda the motion which was unanimously approved by: Cronan, Daniels. Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to lead-based paint renovation, repair, and painting (RRP) until the effective date of the regulations.

Mr. Cronan opened the floor for public comment. No members of Public Comment the public present requested to speak.

Period

Mr. Cronan transferred the Chair to Mr. Hyatt and recused himself Transfer of Chair from the meeting.

Regarding File Number 2013-01184, Junior M. Horna-Pozo, the Board members reviewed the application file, which consisted of the exhibits, transcript, and the Presiding Officer's Summary and Recommendation. Mr. Horna-Pozo was present and addressed the Board. He indicated that he is now a legal resident of the United States and asked the Board to grant him a license. Ms. Howard asked that it be noted in the minutes that the Summary heading which reads Board for Asbestos, Lead, Mold and Home Inspectors should read Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors. Mr. Marston moved to accept the summary and recommendation of the Presiding Officer and approve Mr. Horna-Pozo's asbestos supervisor application. Mr. Koepf seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations. Mr. Cronan recused himself from the meeting and was not present during the discussion or vote as Mr. Horna-Pozo is an employee of his company.

Mr. Marston disclosed that he is familiar with Mr. Marsengill professionally but indicated he can be fair and impartial in consideration of this matter. Mr. Koepf disclosed that he also knows Mr. Marsengill professionally but indicated he can be fair and impartial in consideration of this matter.

Regarding File Number 2012-02812, Gary William Marsengill, the Board members reviewed the Consent Order as seen and agreed

to by Mr. Marsengill. Mr. Marsengill was not present. Howard asked that it be noted in the minutes that the Consent Order heading which reads Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, Mold and Home Inspectors should read Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors. Mr. Vander Pol moved to accept the Consent Order which cites the following violations of the Board's regulations: 18 VAC 15-40-130.A (Count 1); 18 VAC 15-40-190.6 (Count 2); 18 VAC 15-40-180 (Count 3). For these violations, Mr. Marsengill agrees to pay the following monetary penalties: \$50.00 for the violation contained in Count 1; \$200.00 for the violation contained in Count 2; \$250.00 for the violation contained in Count 3; and \$150.00 in Board costs, for a total monetary penalty of \$650.00.

In addition, for violation of Counts 1 through 3, Marsengill agrees to reimburse the \$395.00 inspection fee to Daniel Frank and provide the Board with proof of the payment within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Order. If Marsengill fails to comply with this condition, then license suspension will be automatically imposed until compliance is obtained.

Mr. Fincher seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to (RRP) until the effective date of the regulations. As the reviewing Board member, Mr. Cronan was not present during the discussion or vote.

Mr. Cronan returned to the meeting and resumed the position of Transfer of Chair Chair.

Regarding File Number 2013-00942, Rodney L. Bowers, the Board members reviewed the application file, which consisted of the exhibits, transcript, and the Presiding Officer's Summary and Bowers Recommendation. Mr. Bowers was not present. Mr. Vander Pol moved to accept the summary and recommendation of the Presiding Officer and approve Mr. Bowers' asbestos worker application. Mr. Palmer seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective

date of the regulations. Mr. Hyatt recused himself from the meeting and was not present during the discussion or vote due to his professional relationship with Mr. Bowers.

Regarding File Number 2013-00943, Earl L. Gay, Jr., the Board members reviewed the application file, which consisted of the exhibits, transcript, and the Presiding Officer's Summary and Recommendation. Mr. Gay was not present. Mr. Vander Pol moved to accept the summary and recommendation of the Presiding Officer and approve Mr. Gay's asbestos worker application. Mr. Marston seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations. Mr. Hyatt recused himself from the meeting and was not present during the discussion or vote due to his professional relationship with Mr. Gay.

Regarding File Number 2013-01376, William J. Culpeper, the File Number 2013-Board members reviewed the application file, which consisted of 01376, William J. the exhibits, transcript, and the Presiding Officer's Summary and Culpeper Recommendation. Mr. Culpeper was not present. Mr. Hyatt moved to accept the summary and recommendation of the Presiding Officer and approve Mr. Culpeper's asbestos supervisor Mr. Palmer seconded the motion which was application. unanimously approved by: Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations.

Ms. Henshaw provided an overview of legislation that has been Legislative Update proposed to date for consideration during the 2013 Virginia General Assembly session as it pertains to the Board's programs. Ms. Henshaw explained that all Board and industry- related legislation is monitored by the Board and Department staff. While staff may provide technical information, data, and statistics regarding legislative proposals, Ms. Henshaw reminded the Board

members that neither staff nor the Board has a position on a particular bill until such time as the Governor issues a position. Currently, staff is following Senate Bill 871 and House Bill 1851 (companion bill) and monitoring two agency bills: House Bill 1641 and Senate Bill 1179.

Ms. Henshaw gave an update on the current status of the regulatory review processes for several of the Board's regulatory packages. Regulatory Activity The fee adjustment changes in the Asbestos Licensing Regulations. Lead-Based Paint Activities Regulations, and the Certified Home Inspector Regulations are currently undergoing review by the Governor's office.

Update on

Ms. Henshaw discussed the Governor's Regulatory Reform Initiative to conduct a comprehensive review of all DPOR Governor's regulations currently in place and repeal regulations that are Regulatory unnecessary or no longer in use, reduce unnecessary regulatory Reform Initiative burdens on individuals, businesses, and other regulated groups, and identify statutes that require unnecessary or overly burdensome regulations.

Discussion of

A public comment period was held from November to early December to receive comments on regulations that could be amended to reduce regulatory burdens. eliminated or Simultaneously, staff conducted a review of the regulations to identify areas that can be reduced or eliminated. Two public comments were received: one regarding the Asbestos Licensing Regulations and one regarding the Certified Home Inspector Regulations.

Ms. Henshaw advised the Board that staff conducted a review of Consider the regulations and based upon this review and the public Authorization of comments received indicated that a review of the regulations was NOIRA warranted. The Board discussed the following potential amendments: renewal procedures in 18 VAC 15-20-70 and the number of instructors required for a training program in 18 VAC 15-20-520 of the Asbestos Licensing Regulations; late renewal procedures in 18 VAC 15-30-167 of the Lead-Based Paint Activities Regulations; Continuing Professional Education (CPE) requirements in 18 VAC 15-40-72; and reinstatement in 18 VAC 15-40-90 of the Certified Home Inspector Regulations. Henshaw advised that a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action (NOIRA) for the Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors Regulations must be authorized by the Board if it wishes to initiate

the regulatory review process pursuant to the Governor's Regulatory Reform Initiative. A motion was made by Mr. Hyatt to authorize staff to file a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action for the Asbestos Licensing Regulations, Lead-Based Paint Activities Regulations, and Certified Home Inspector Regulations to proceed with consideration of amendments as discussed as well as any other amendments that may be identified that achieve the objectives of the Governor's Regulatory Reform Initiative. Mr. Palmer seconded the motion which was approved by: Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations. Member voting in opposition to the motion was Mr. Koepf.

The Board recessed for a break at 10:48 a.m. and reconvened at Break 11:09 a.m.

Mr. Marston seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations.

The Board was provided with a memorandum from Ms. Hrynciw requesting Board guidance on the lead-based paint training grace period for lead license renewals. After discussion, Mr. Hyatt made a motion to adopt a guidance document to provide that the Board allow refresher training taken within three months of the 36 month period allowed by regulation be considered in compliance with the regulations, provided that all other requirements are met. Mr. Vander Pol seconded the motion which was unanimously approved Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to

vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations.

The Board was provided with a memorandum from Ms. Hrynciw requesting Board guidance on home inspector general liability insurance for home inspectors. After discussion, Mr. Hvatt made a motion to adopt a guidance document to provide that the Board allow a business liability insurance policy or a commercial general liability insurance policy with minimum limits of \$250,000 to be considered to meet the entry requirement found at 18 VAC 15-40-30.9. Further, it is acceptable for the applicant to be listed as an additional insured on a company general liability insurance policy, business liability insurance policy, or commercial general liability insurance policy instead of the policy being in the applicant's name so long as the minimum requirements of 18 VAC 15-40-30.9 are met. If for any reason Board staff cannot reasonably ensure that the applicant is sufficiently covered by the company's policy in accordance with 18 VAC 15-40-30.9, Board staff may require that requisite coverage be obtained in the name of the individual Mr. Fincher seconded the motion which was applicant. unanimously approved by: Cronan, Daniels, Fincher, Hyatt, Koepf, Marston, Nixon, Palmer, and Vander Pol. Board members Holtz and Nash were present but did not vote because, by statute, they are ineligible to vote on matters unrelated to RRP until the effective date of the regulations.
