Purpose

The purpose of this action is to amend the Virginia Pollution Abatement (VPA) permit regulation in order to facilitate consistency with the other regulations which governs the pollutant management activities at Animal Feeding Operations (AFOs). The VPA permit regulation governs the pollutant management activities of animal wastes at AFOs. The VPA permit regulation contains obsolete definitions which are not consistent with the existing general permit for AFOs as well as related federal definitions. The amendments and reissuance of the VPA General Permit Regulation for Animal Feeding Operations (AFOs) will be covered by a concurrent NOIRA.

Virginia Code §62.1-44.15.(5) authorizes the State Water Control Board to permit the management and discharge of sewage, industrial wastes and other wastes into or adjacent to state waters; and the alteration otherwise of the physical, chemical or biological properties of state waters. The Virginia Pollution Abatement Regulation defines the procedures and requirements to be followed in connection with VPA permits issued by the Board pursuant to the State Water Control Law.

Need

The VPA permit regulation contains obsolete definitions which are not consistent with the existing general permit for AFOs as well as related federal definitions. Specific terms and definitions need to be consistent among all State Water Control Board regulations which address AFOs. The VPA permit regulation must be amended in order to maintain consistency among the regulations which govern AFOs.

Substance

This action will amend the VPA permit regulation in order to bring consistency to the regulations which govern AFOs. Significant changes are not expected; however, the following items will be considered in the development of a regulatory proposal:

1. This regulatory action will amend definitions and terms used in the VPA permit regulation, including "concentrated confined animal feeding operation" and "confined animal feeding operation" in order to bring consistency to the State Water Control Board regulations which govern AFOs.

2. Other amendments to the VPA permit regulation related to AFOs may be considered by the Board based on comments received in response to this notice and discussions of the technical advisory committee.

The concurrent NOIRA to amend the VPA General Permit Regulation for Animal Feeding Operations (AFOs) will address similar amendments.

Alternatives

One alternative is to not amend the VPA permit regulation. However, not amending the VPA permit regulation may broaden the differences between the regulations which govern the AFOs thereby increasing the possibility of inconsistencies between the requirements in the general permit and the individual permit. The amendments are necessary to obtain consistency among the regulations which govern AFOs. The Department will consider all alternatives which are considered to be less burdensome and less intrusive for achieving the essential purpose of the amendment, and any other alternatives presented during the proposed rulemaking.

Public hearing at proposed stage

A public hearing will not be held after publication of the proposed stage of the regulatory action unless requests for a public hearing are received during the NOIRA public comment period from at least 25 persons.

Technical advisory committee

A technical advisory committee will be involved in the development of the proposed regulation.

Due to the need for consistency between the regulations which govern activities at AFOs, the Board will utilize the technical advisory committee that is established in response to the concurrent NOIRA for the VPA General Permit Regulation for Animal Feeding Operations (AFOs).

Family impact

AFO - Animal Feeding Operations

300 A.U. - "300 animal units" means 300,000 pounds of live animal weight, or the following numbers and types of animals:

- a. 300 slaughter and feeder cattle;
- b. 200 mature dairy cattle (whether milked or dry cows);
- c. 750 swine each weighing over 25 kilograms (approximately 55 pounds);
- d. 150 horses;
- e. 3,000 sheep or lambs;
- f. 16,500 turkeys;
- g. 30,000 laying hens or broilers.
