The variance provides relief from the seasonal restrictions in 9 VAC 5-40-5630 A 8 and 10 for the County of Gloucester in the Hampton Roads Volatile Organic Compound Emissions Control Area. The variance would no longer be in effect after December 31, 2008.

The seasonal restrictions apply to the open burning of waste for the:

- Disposal of clean burning construction waste, debris waste, and demolition waste resulting from property maintenance, from the development or modification of roads and highways, parking areas, railroad tracks, pipelines, power and communication lines, buildings or building areas, sanitary landfills, or from any other clearing operations.
- Disposal of clean burning construction waste, debris waste, and demolition waste on the site of local landfills.

Current practices for debris disposal the County of Gloucester do include open burning, and this variance will allow time for the locality to develop alternatives.

Statement of Final Agency Action

On March 26, 2007, the State Air Pollution Control Board adopted a variance entitled "Variance for Open Burning" (9 VAC Chapter 240). The variance is to be effective on May 1, 2007.

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SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS OF PUBLIC TESTIMONY FOR REGULATION REVISION EV CONCERNING

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SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS ON OPEN BURNING (9 VAC 5 CHAPTER 240)

INTRODUCTION

At the December 2006 meeting, the board authorized the department to promulgate for public comment a proposed regulation revision concerning seasonal restrictions on open burning.

A public hearing was advertised accordingly and held in Virginia Beach, Virginia on January 19, 2007 and the public comment period closed on February 5, 2007. The proposed regulation subject to the hearing is summarized below followed by a summary of the public participation process and an analysis of the public testimony, along with the basis for the decision of the board.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The proposed regulation concerns provisions covering seasonal restrictions on open burning. A summary of the regulation follows:

- 1. For the purposes of applicability of the seasonal restrictions in 9 VAC 5-40-5630 A 8 and 10 only, the Hampton Roads Volatile Organic Compound Emissions Control Area does not include the County of Gloucester and the County of Isle of Wight.
- 2. The variance shall not be applicable after December 31, 2008.

SUMMARY OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS

A public hearing was held in Virginia Beach, Virginia on January 19, 2007. Three persons attended the hearing, one of whom offered testimony, and two additional written comments were received during the public comment period. As required by law, notice of this hearing was given to the public on or about December 19, 2007 in the Virginian-Pilot and in the Virginia Register. In addition, personal notice of this hearing and the opportunity to comment was given by mail to those persons on the department's list to receive notices of proposed regulation revisions. A list of hearing attendees and the complete text or an account of each person's testimony is included in the hearing report which is on file at the department.

ANALYSIS OF TESTIMONY

Below is a summary of each person's testimony and the accompanying analysis. Included is a brief statement of the subject, the identification of the commenter, the text of the comment and the board's response (analysis and action taken). 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1. **SUBJECT**: Seasonal burning variance in Gloucester County.

COMMENTER: Gloucester County

TEXT: The Gloucester County Board of Supervisors supports the proposed variance to the seasonal open burning restrictions.

RESPONSE: Support for the proposal is appreciated.

No change has been made to the proposal as a result of this comment.

2. **SUBJECT**: Seasonal burning variance in Gloucester County.

COMMENTER: Berkshire Enterprises LTD

<u>TEXT</u>: Mr. Raymont Leiffer, owner of Berkshire Enterprises LTD, commented that the open burning ban variance will be helpful to the contractors in Gloucester. He feels that the open burning restrictions are a great impact on contractors, especially small businesses. Mr. Leiffer stated that no state money is currently available for loans to help the small businessman to find alternatives to the burning laws. Alternatives are very expensive. He'd like DEQ to look at other alternatives to limit impact on contractors in this particular business.

RESPONSE: Support for the proposal is appreciated.

No change has been made to the proposal as a result of this comment.

3. **SUBJECT**: Open burning ordinance in Isle of Wight County

COMMENTER: Isle of Wight County

TEXT: The Isle of Wight County Board of Supervisors requests that Isle of Wight County be excluded from the variance due to a local open burning ordinance being adopted in that jurisdiction.

RESPONSE: As requested, Isle of Wight has been removed from the proposed variance so that the open burning seasonal restrictions will be effective in 2007.
