This action amends the Regulations of the Auctioneers Board to conform to changes resulting from the enactment of [Chapter 772](#) of the 2026 Acts of Assembly. The legislation permits regulatory boards under the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (“DPOR”) to take disciplinary cases under advisement as provided for in § 54.1-201 A 7 of the Code of Virginia. The legislation also amends the enabling statute of the Auctioneers Board (“the Board”) to reference §§ 54.1-201 and 54.1-202 of the Code of Virginia, which provide for (i) the general powers and duties of DPOR regulatory boards; and (ii) the power of DPOR regulatory boards to impose monetary penalties.

This action amends the applicable section of the regulation pertaining to the Board’s authority to impose regulatory discipline to (i) provide that the Board may take disciplinary cases under advisement in lieu of other disciplinary sanctions as provided for in § 54.1-201 A 7 of the Code of Virginia; and (ii) clearly specify that the Board may impose the following sanctions against a credential held by a regulant:

- Fine;
- Suspension of license;
- Probation;
- Failing to renew a license; or
- Revocation of license.

This action is exempt from the Administrative Process Act under § 2.2-4006(A)(4)(a) of the Code of Virginia, which states in part:

A. The following agency actions otherwise subject to this chapter and § 2.2-4103 of the Virginia Register Act shall be exempted from the operation of this article:

4. Regulations that are:

a. Necessary to conform to changes in Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act where no agency discretion is involved. However, such regulations shall be filed with the Registrar within 90 days of the law's effective date;

Mandate and Impetus

In April 2026, the Governor approved [Chapter 772](#) (HB 1305) of the 2026 Acts of Assembly. Chapter 772 amends several sections of the Code of Virginia related to DPOR and its regulatory boards. These changes include:

- Amending § 54.1-201 A of the Code of Virginia, which provides for powers and duties of regulatory boards, to permit DPOR regulatory boards to take disciplinary cases against licensees under advisement, defer a finding in such cases, and dismiss such actions under terms and conditions established by the Board for Professional and Occupational Regulation.
- Amending § 54.1-602 of the Code of Virginia, which provides for the Board's disciplinary powers, to incorporate applicable provisions of §§ 54.1-201 and 54.1-202 of the Code of Virginia.

This legislation became effective on July 1, 2026.

The purpose of this regulatory change is to implement and comply with changes to the Code of Virginia resulting from the passage of HB 1305 during the 2026 General Assembly session.
