Section 150:

The proposed amendment is to remove Smith Creek in Alleghany County and add Grassy Creek and its tributaries within the boundaries of Breaks Interstate Park in relation to the required use of artificial lures with single hooks in trout waters.

The first proposed amendment is to reflect the discontinuation of stocking and the lack of the establishment of a fishery in Smith Creek – there is no longer a reason to require special regulations in this stretch of water.

The second proposed change is to reflect an effort to develop a quality trout fishery in Breaks Interstate Park in conjunction with Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife and to simplify regulations for anglers between both Agencies.
