Section 60:

A subsection D is being proposed as an amendment to reflect joint regulations for the South Holston Reservoir regarding the use of juglines, limblines, and trotlines by anglers to provide consistency in regulations regarding these activities between the Department and the state of Tennessee on the shared waters of the South Holson Reservoir.

Mandate and Impetus

This amendment will formalize the regulation requirement within Administrative Code and ensure consistency with regulations on the Reservoir set by the Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency.
