Preamble

The APA (Code of Virginia § 2.2-4011) states that an "emergency situation" is: (i) a situation involving an imminent threat to public health or safety; or (ii) a situation in which Virginia statutory law, the Virginia appropriation act, or federal law requires that a regulation shall be effective in 280 days or less from its enactment, or in which federal regulation requires a regulation to take effect no later than 280 days from its effective date.

- 1) Please explain why this is an "emergency situation" as described above.

1) House Bill 1198 (2004) requires that these emergency regulations be effective 280 days from the date of enactment (April12, 2004).

2) Key provisions in the regulations are the development and maintenance of an emergency management plan by community waterworks to provide pure water during extended power outages of no less than five days. The plan will address procedures for obtaining and distributing potable water, notification procedures to public officials, customers and the media, emergency disinfection procedures, and telephone numbers for state regulatory personnel, waterworks personnel, and energy suppliers to the waterworks.

In preparation for another event such as was seen during the aftermath of Hurricane Isabel, this regulation will better prepare the community waterworks in Virginia to respond to an extended power outage. Although some community waterworks have emergency standby power, there is no requirement for community waterworks to develop and maintain an emergency management plan to verify they are prepared for an extended power outage.
