The current *Virginia EMS Regulations* describing the process for exemption requests for agencies and entities require a resolution from the local governing body as part of the request process. The new *Code* language now allows the flexibility for the chief administrative officer for that jurisdiction to approve such a request, thus reducing the burden on local government. In addition, the current *Virginia EMS Regulations* require an individual to obtain a resolution from the local governing body as part of the variance/exemption process. The new *Code* language now allows for the affiliated provider to seek only the signature of their Operational Medical director and the chief officer of the agency for which they are affiliated. This removes the burden for both the provider and the local governing body in unnecessary bureaucracy. For those unaffiliated providers, the new *Code* language allows for a simple application process that may allow for additional documentation as required by the Health Commissioner. This

regulatory action conforms the Virginia EMS Regulations to the provisions of Code of Virginia, as amended by HB1675 of 2011.
