The *Code of Virginia* (1950) as amended, § 32.1-325, grants to the Board of Medical Assistance Services the authority to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance. The *Code of Virginia* (1950) as amended, § 32.1-324, authorizes the Director of DMAS to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance according to the Board's requirements. The Medicaid authority as established by § 1902 (a) of the *Social Security Act* [42 U.S.C. 1396a] provides governing authority for payments for services.

The amended regulatory text is necessary as a result of changes to Code of Federal Regulations at 42 CFR 484.36. The changes, promulgated by CMS, are authorized under sections 1861 and 1891 of the federal Social Security Act. The final rule effective date is July 13, 2017.

The *Code of Virginia*, § 2.2-4006.A.4.c, permits agencies to pursue final exempt actions for regulatory changes that are "[n]ecessary to meet the requirements of federal law or regulations, provided such regulations do not differ materially from those required by federal law or regulation..." and § 2.2-4006.A.3 permits final exempt actions for "changes in style or form."

## Substance

On January 13, 2017, U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) issued final regulations to amend the COPs for HHAs. Among the changes, the final rule recodifies 42 CFR 484.36 in the newly created 42 CFR 484.80 (82 FR 4504, see table at page 4514). The final rule effective date is July 13, 2017. In order to comply with the federal final rule, Virginia regulations need to be amended to update the CFR citation that is referenced for home health aide and hospice requirements.
