### **Purpose**

The purpose of this requested action is to secure approval of the agency's initiation of the Article 2 process for the promulgation of the RUGs methodology for the Nursing Home Payment System. The 2000 Appropriations Act directed the Department to "...adopt regulations providing for the implementation of a new reimbursement system based in a Resource Utilization Groups (RUGs) methodology to reflect resident intensity." The current Nursing Home Payment System (NHPS) has relied on the same methodology (the Patient Intensity Rating System (PIRS)) to adjust payment for service intensity since 1991. Both the Department and the regulated industry are in agreement that the system needs to be converted to a more sophisticated methodology similar to that which has recently been developed and implemented by Medicare, Resource Utilization Groups (RUGs)).

Federal (42 CFR Part 447) and state law (Code sec. 32.1-325) require that the methodology used by the Medicaid agency to set nursing facility rates be specified in regulations. Therefore, if the Department wishes to change the existing methodology, it must amend existing regulations. However, there is no federal or state mandate explicitly requiring that this particular new methodology be adopted at this time.

This proposed regulatory action will substitute language describing a RUGS methodology for existing language that describes the PIRS methodology. These methodologies represent two different ways of adjusting nursing facility rates to recognize that residents with higher service intensity require more expensive care than those with lower service intensity. The existing PIRS methodology has been used for ten years. The RUGS methodology will more accurately reflect resident service intensity and, therefore, will be more appropriate and equitable. The Department and the affected industry have met together over a period of many months to review the RUGS methodology and are in agreement concerning the appropriateness of this change. As this regulation is developed the Department and industry will continue to analyze any potential fiscal impact of the change on specific providers.

#### **Alternatives**

The regulation is intended to authorize a change to the payment system that will pay providers more appropriately for services. It has been developed in consultation with provider representatives and takes their views into account.
